and intermediate classes to create two more levels.

She is also trying to arrange a student exchange between Germany and Canada. Three girls and three boys would go to Germany for a specified period of time and then six German girls and boys would come over here. The town of Leverkusen is willing to have the exchange she says. The only

hold-up is the price of the airline tickets, which Krudwig does not want the kids' parents to pay. She's hoping to find sponsors for the airfare.

# XP?

## CAN WE COUNT ON YOU?

Before anyone can vote, a list of eligible voters must be prepared. This is called ENUMERATION. To be on the Voters' List, you must be: 18 years of age, a Canadian citizen and residing in Canada on July 27.

ENUMERATION differs in Urban and Rural areas; here's how it works

**URBAN AREAS**

If you live in an urban area (pop. 5000+) you will be visited by two enumerators who will be carrying Elections Canada identification. When they come to your door, they'll ask for your name and the names of all Canadian citizens over 18 years of age residing in your home.

The enumerators will leave you one receipt (FORM F-301) for each person enumerated. Keep this handy until you receive your NOTICE OF ENUMERATION card in the mail in a few days. This card replaces the Voters' List that used to be sent to your home and displayed publicly.

Your NOTICE OF ENUMERATION card tells you where and when you will be able to vote. Please read it carefully. If there are any mistakes, you should have them corrected during Revision on August 15, 16, and 17. And keep it handy, it's a good reminder of exactly where and when to vote.



**RURAL AREAS**

Enumeration in Rural Canada is somewhat different. An enumerator will prepare a Voters' List for your polling division which will be publicly displayed. Then, you'll be sent a NOTICE OF ENUMERATION card.

**AWAY ON VACATION?**

If you have reason to believe that you will be away from your place of ordinary residence during Election time and you want to vote on September 4th, please note the following: The Canada Elections Act stipulates that to qualify for voting your name must appear on the Electoral list for the riding where you ordinarily reside and not on the list of a riding where you stay temporarily. Such as the place where you spend your vacation.

Complete details about Revision, Advance Polls and Election Day will be published in the coming weeks.
