Next came a string of gigs around Toronto and a fateful meeting with new wave artist Willy DeVille, leader of New York's Mink DeVille.

GOOD CHANGE

"When I met Willy I told him I really liked his material, which was, in my opinion, a good change from disco, and the best of new wave," James reminisced.

The two musicians hit it off right away and spent the night together jamming away.

The following evening the two were together again and DeVille said if his guitar player ever quit, James would be getting a call.

Sure enough, two months later, James was on his way to New York and the big time.

What followed, was to say the least, an eye opening experience for James. First they went into the studio and recorded "Stand by Me" which was released in the U.S. and Europe. Then it was overseas for a full-fledged tour playing to thousands of people each night.

"It was professional from the word go," said James. "We had bands like the Steve Miller Band backing us up and it seemed everything was done for us. There was even someone there to tune my guitar."

During the tour James met the Rolling Stones and spent a night singing and talking with the band at Keith Richard's place in Hanover, England.

James said he learned a lot from the tour, seeing both the good and bad sides of the industry.

"On the bad side there's the accessibility of drugs and the resulting tragedy," James said, "and, on the positive side, I was able to take a lot of what I learned and apply it to the group here."

FIRST ALBUM

Now, with the release of his first album, James' career has reached a new plateau. Previously he didn't feel it was necessary to tour all over the country because he has a tremendous following close to home but with the album out and doing well (2,000 copies have been sold already and another pressing is scheduled soon to keep up with demand) he'll be ready to hit the road within the next year.

The Acton concert is something James is really looking forward to.

"It should be a terrific time," said James. "Some of the best entertainers in the business will be there to make it a success for everyone."
