Ministry of Natural Resources will again administer a four-day controlled deer hunt in Cambridge District which includes Halton. There will be six zones which will include the northern twothirds of Halton Region and the townships of Puslinch, Flamborough, North Dumfries, South Dumfries and Guelph for the

November 5 to 8 hunt. Eleven hundred hunters will be selected by lottery draw. Seventyfive per cent of the validation tags will go to zone residents. In addition, any person who qualifies for a farmer's licence to hunt deer or who

owns, or rents and legally resides on a parcel of land of at least 50 acres is eligible for a validation tag, without entering the draw. This tag is valid only for the zone in which the land is situated. One other member of the immediate family residing on the property is also eligible for a validation tag. Farmers and landowners can obtain their validation tags at the Ministry office in Cambridge after August 1. Other

hunters can obtain applications for

applications is August 31. The draw will be held during the week of September 10 and successful hunters should receive their validation tags in late September.

Validation tags which must be attached to a 1984 Ontario Resident or Farmer's deer licence, are valid for only one zone, are not transferrable and entitle the holder to only one deer, with or without an-

Golf Doctor

The Upper Body Being able to maintain the upper body position at the same angle at the top of the round as it was at the start will enable you to come back to the ball and sweep it off the surface of the ground.

If you have maintained that angle throughout the swing those fat shots and their top shots become less.

What happens when the upper body changes from its original position? Well, if the upper body changes to a position of one which is higher than originally set up you will 'top! top! top!' all the way down the fairway and if your position is one which is lower than the original set up, you will hit the turf before you strike the

Why?

As the arms travel, a change in the body position will also alter the arm

movement which will in turn alter the club movement which again will alter the ability to return back to the ball. So as you can see any exaggeration in the body position will alter the course of the arm motion therefore affecting the ability to strike the ball effectively and efficiently.

In the last weeks I've gone through three basic positions to maintain as the arm travels to the top of the backswing. To recap those three postions one is to make sure that the upper arms and shoulders start the backswing. As the backswing starts and reaches the top, both the right side position and upper body angle have been maintained.

Practise these factors, and you begin to set yourself up for that decisive and authoritative move through the ball. Next week the downswing.


