

You can vote at an Advance Poll if you:


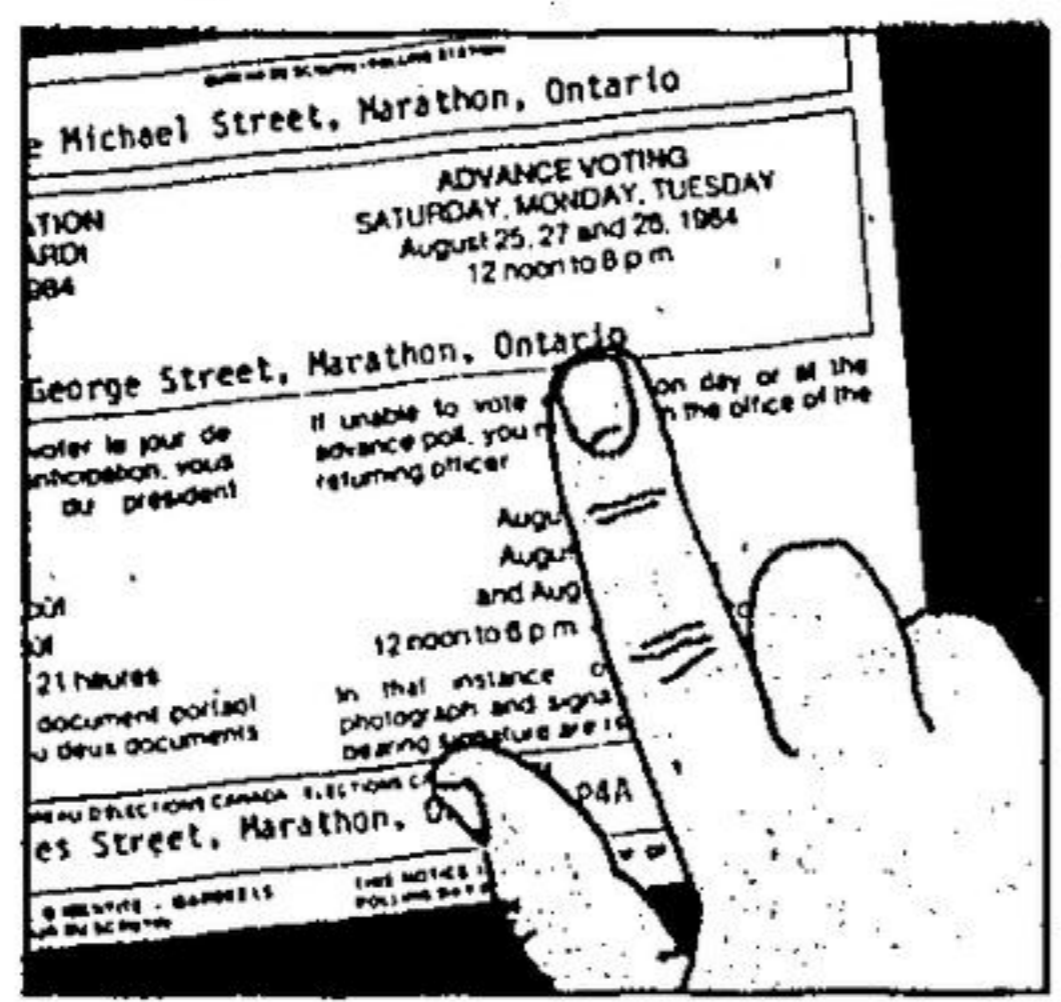
- have reason to believe that you won't be able to vote on September 4; or
- are elderly, ill or physically disabled.

Your name, however, must be on the Voters' List.

WHERE AND WHEN?

Advance Polls are open on August 25, 27, and 28 from noon to 8 p.m. The location of your Advance Poll is listed on your NOTICE OF ENUMERATION card.

Physically disabled electors have the right to vote at an Advance Poll with level access. If there is no level access at your Advance Poll, contact the Elections Canada Office for your riding. Arrangements will be made for you to vote in a location with level access.

NOTE

PROXY voting not permitted at Advance Polls.

IF YOU CAN'T VOTE AT THE ADVANCE POLL OR ON ELECTION DAY

and your name is on the Voters' List, you may vote at the Office of the Returning Officer. For more information, contact the Elections Canada Office for your riding. The telephone number appears on your NOTICE OF ENUMERATION card and is available from Directory Assistance.
