If the Madison's future is as successful as the David Wilcox concert held there Thursday night, the club will likely become a Halton Hills hot spot.

A combination of great music, a party atmosphere and a superb sound system was # treat for nearly 500 patrons of the club, formerly the Riviera.

Located on Hwy. 7 in Norval the club is within easy travelling distance of Mississauga and Brampton. According to the club's manager and promotions agent Brian James they should be able to pack the facility every night.

James remarked he is aiming for the under 30's crowd with top notch entertalners, video and good food to attract people to his establishment.

James also noted that because of an extremely poor track record recently the club's reputation has really taken a beating but he said he and the staff are out to change all that.

Formerly the proprietor of a music store and sound system rental agency this is James's first try at running a night club, however, his exposure to numerous other clubs and entertainers through his business makes him well suited to take on the job.

"It's not going to be easy to break a bad reputation," he explained, "so we're giving it all we can to give people a good time." The club has a capacity for about 700 people and its design is a relief from ac-


