Have you noticed your son or daughter hasn't been as restless this year as in past? Maybe you've been able to do your grocery shopping without little hands grabbing things off the shelf. If you've had some quiet times this summer without paying the expense of a babysitter or daycare, maybe you have Gloria Walton to thank for that.

Gloria, working with children's librarian Marie Arbic, has been organizing and running children's programs at the Acton Public Library which have kept many Acton youngsters busy for an hour or two a day. Gloria, a 21-year-old McMaster University student, wishes she had more children attend the programs because she loves working with children and sometimes the

poor turnout (as low as three at one time) was "disappointing." She worked with children ages three to 10 or 11, which is good experience for her—she hopes to become an elementary school teacher some day. The only problem she sometimes encountered was a lack of enthusiasm on the part of the kids. "When the kids aren't very enthusiastic I had to really work at it, really ham it up," she said. The children seemed to enjoy the backyard scientists program the most. They got to do simple air and electrical experiments and they learned a few things, too. "But we try not to make it too much like school," said Gloria.

The Tuesday Travellers and Junior Voyagers programs took kids to different lands to learn about their customs, food, and language. Gloria, along with summer students working at the Georgetown library, made up crafts the kids could do which related to the countries they discussed. A story from the country was read and a film was shown and although Gloria presented it in a "fun" atmosphere, the kids were bound to learn something. Munch to the movies was the most popular program, possibly because no registration was required. The children just dropped in and sat eating their lunches while watching movies.

It was Gloria's first time working at the library and she doesn't know if she'll be back next year, but she says she'll miss the children. "There were some kids who came back every week and there were some real sweet-

hearts," she said. The programs are finished for this year, but they will probably be back again next year. They are free, and a good opportunity for your child to learn and have fun while you enjoy some of the summer weather.

Hinton surprised by LDC deferral

A local landowner was "startled" and "put out" that he was not informed of a Town request to defer his application for a land severance until the night of his hearing. As far as H.H. (Bert) Hinton knew, there were no objections to his application to divide his land, fronting on Willow St., into two pieces of land so he could sell it.

The Land Division Committee voted to defer the matter for two months, pending a written report by planning staff supported by an in-person presentation by a delegate.

If the Town has resolved the matter before the next hearing, the Committee will hear Hinton.

The land is designated residential-commercial.

However, a letter from Town council dated Aug. 22 was presented at Hinton's Land Division Committee hearing last Tuesday asking for a two-month deferral to allow Town planning staff to prepare a report. The land was identified in the Business Improvement Association's down-
