Chipping
 There you are just off the apron of the green only 40 feet from the hole. You get ready you take the club back and "oh no", your next shot comes from the other side of the green out of the sand trap.
 How often does this happen? Unfortunately too often, and the score, it sure does add up quickly. All the more reason to learn how to improve your short game.
 In this issue I'll discuss the area of chipping. The most important factor is the address position. In positioning yourself at the ball the following procedure is followed. The grip, ball position, remain the same. The changes which take place are as follows: The stance has become narrower with the weight favouring the front foot. The body position is closer to the ball, helping to ease the

Tips from the Golf Doctor

 Practice techniques
 Setting yourself up to the ball, you start off with the SW and continue up to the iron. Your procedure is to take the arms to a point just past the back leg—no further—then go through. Take five swings with each club being careful to notice the distance you receive with each club, but only from one swing. This practice procedure takes about fifteen minutes but will certainly play an important role in club selection around the greens. You have now eliminated a lot of the guess work on how hard to hit the ball. You now have developed one golf swing. The choice is only the right club.
 Note: This technique is used more for shots that have no hazards or high mounds to carry.
 Next week I'll discuss a simple method of hitting those rusty uneven line shots.
