Constable rescues brothers from creek

Police Officer of the Month is an award sponsored by Metroland Community Newspapers and is given out to members of the Halton Regional Police department in recognition of special effort.

This month's selection is 32-year-old Greg Braun, a Milton constable and resident who saved two brothers from possible drowning in the 16-Mile Creek area of Millside Dr.

This is the second occasion Constable Braun has received the award. Three years ago he was recognized for the dramatic arrest of two men who broke into a Milton business.
