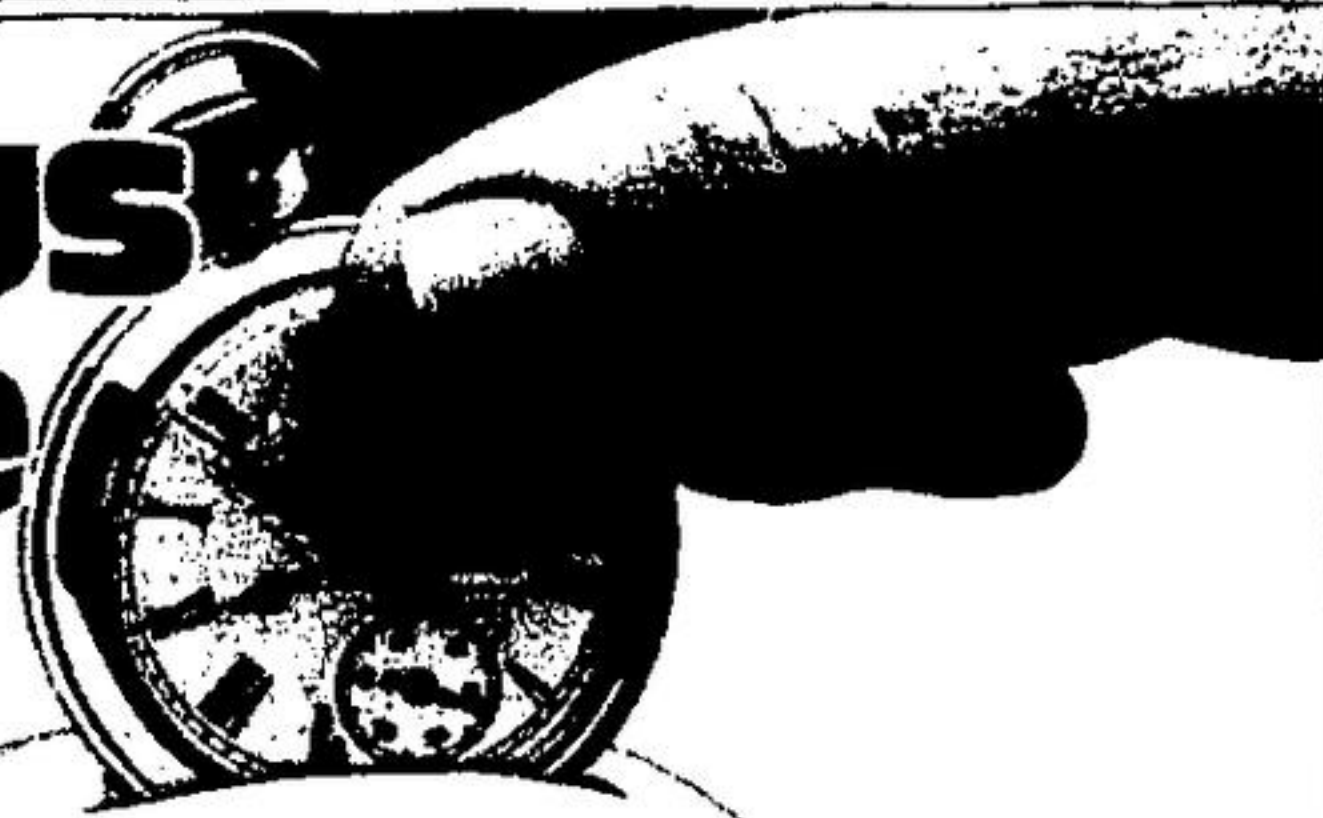

**Officer of the Month**

**Constable rescues  
brothers from creek**

Police Officer of the Month is an award sponsored by Metroland Community Newspapers and is given out to members of the Halton Regional Police department in recognition of special effort.

This month's selection is 32-year-old Greg Braun, a Milton constable and resident who saved two brothers from possible drowning in the 16-Mile Creek area of Millside Dr. Constable Braun was off-duty and at home at the time of the incident. He and his wife

Peggy had sat down dinner in their Millside Dr. apartment when they suddenly heard screams.

"They were not playful kind of screams... Peggy went out onto the balcony and spotted the two kids in the creek," he recalled.

It was cold on March 24, but the officer stopped only long enough to lace on running shoes before dashing down four flights of stairs.

Thirteen-year-old David McGuigan and his older brother Jimi 14, of 39 Court St. had been walking along the creek embankment on their way to Holy Rosary Church when David slipped on the icy surface and fell into the creek.

The current was too strong for the boy to reach the edge and his older brother jumped in and held his brother above the water.

Greg Braun arrived in time to pull the youngest out and then his older brother from the icy water. Both were soaked and the youngest had apparently already gone under once.

The police officer then escorted them back to his home where he got them into some dry clothes and called their parents.

An officer for eight years, Constable Braun is modest about the rescue.

"I didn't think it was a big deal... it is the kind of thing any human being would do," he said.

Constable Braun is a Kitchener native but moved to Milton after joining the Halton Regional Police department.

He worked briefly in Georgetown before assuming patrol duties in Milton.

This is the second occasion Constable Braun has received the award. Three years ago he was recognized for the dramatic arrest of two men who broke into a Milton business.
