

Tips from the Golf

Doctor

Today I'll be discussing a simple method of handling these lies without altering your grip, stance or aim. The only change made is with the angle of the club face. Now let's take a look at the various uneven lie situations.

The Side Hill lie

Let us assume you are a five iron distance from the green. Now, go through your routine of address position with one exception-clubface position. If the ball is below your feet you drop down to a six iron and slightly close the face of the golf club. The opposite is true when the ball is placed above your feet. You now go to a 4iron and open the face of the golf club. Either situation will cut down the exaggerated movement of the golf ball. Uphill. downwhill lie

Again assume you are a five iron distance from the green. And again assume your normal address position and again with one exception-club selection. If the ball is positioned on an uphill lie go to a 4 iron; the opposite is true for a downhill lie. You now go from a five iron to a six iron. The reason for the changes taken are quite simple. An uphill lie has already increased the angle of the clubface, therefore making a five iron a six iron loft, therefore you go to the four iron. And of course the opposite is true. Take time to practice these shots, they'll save you a "bundle" of shots during a round of golf.


