Rene Schwarz has enrolled at the University of Guelph.

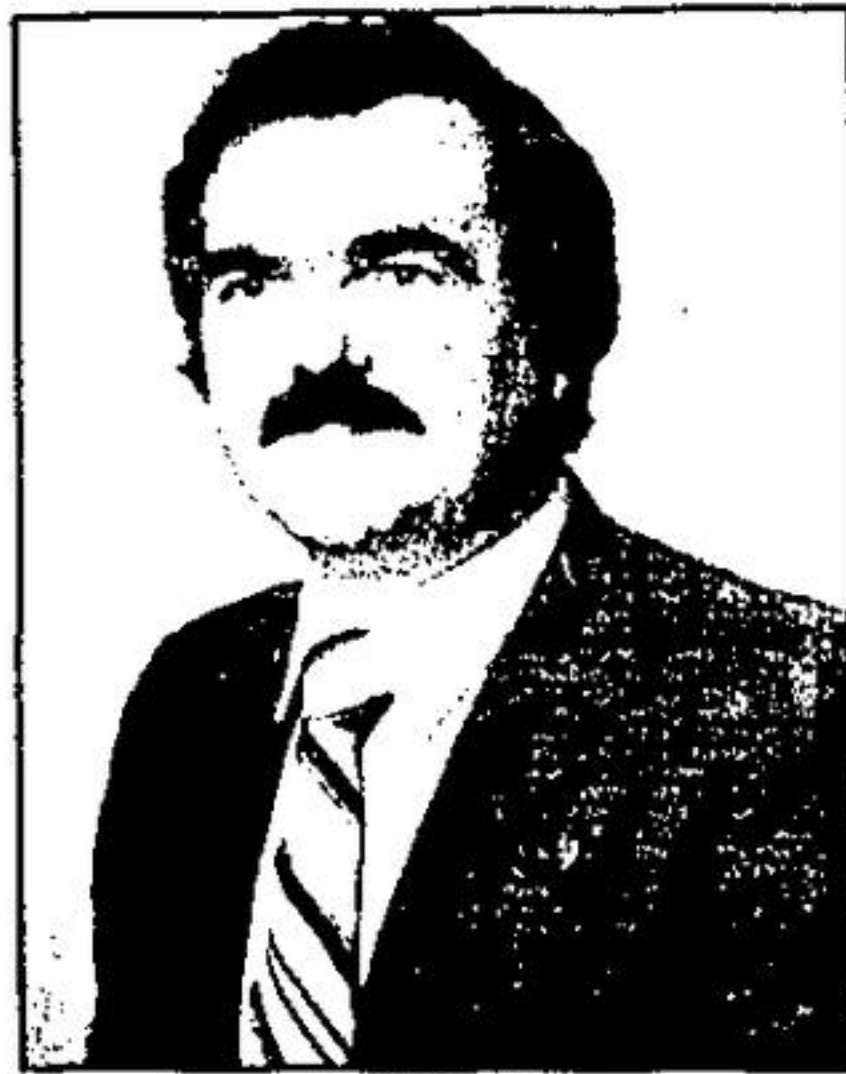
**Quinn seeks
