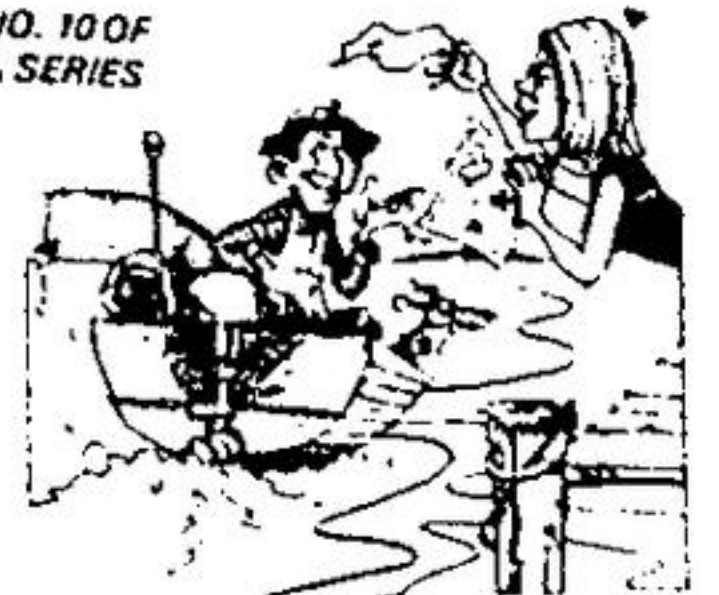

Outdoors

Ideas on how to catch salmon and rainbow in the various rivers are a dime a dozen. Various lures are still a good bet but the hooks must be sharp and strong and of a medium size.

Streamer flies of various colour schemes are good if patience is the angler's lot. Yarn flies tied on good strong short shank hooks with up eye (most of these hooks are gold plated), my choice of size would be six or four. The body can be bright orange and the wing can be yarn used for hooking rugs. It's important though to keep it short and combed out. Each one can be weighted with lead with various turns of lead wire to meet the various depths of water especially when cast upstream and let drift free over the river bottom.

Marshmallows are a proven producer for rainbows and salmon and, of course, the reliable roe bag. Most of my good sized salmon and rainbow were caught while using a red and white dare-devil wobbler 1/8 of an inch short of three inches. Big trophy brook trout from six pounds to eight pounds were also taken on this wobbling devil, but then that's another story that would fill a book. Now it's scramble. So may tight lines by yours on future trips. Safe journey.
