Venture capital

Students paint mail boxes brighten up the area

Through the Student Venture Capital program young entrepreneurs are establishing and operating their own summer businesses with the assistance of interest-free loans. The loans are contracted at Royal Bank branches up to a maximum of \$2,000 per venture. Program participants are required to repay the loan by October 1, 1984. Before approval, all business proposals are reviewed by the local Chamber of Commerce/Board of Trade in co-operation with the Ontario Youth Secretariat.

If the village of Erin has been looking more picturesque this summer, part of the credit must go to 16-year-old Maralee Chambers and 18-year-old Samantha Reed. The enterprising duo, who attend Erin District High School painted and reconditioned many of the mailboxes in the Erin area.

Maralee and Samantha, who together have started The Paintbox will sand, prime, and paint a customer's mailbox and post, and if necessary even cut the surrounding grass. As Maralee says, "The hardest part of this business is often just finding the mailbox among all the long grass and weeds."

After completing their 56th job Samantha and Maralee were ready to get into the even more difficult field of mailbox "customizing". They have already done boxes with flowers, and fruit on them. "But," says Maralee "our greatest masterpiece was a multi-coloured rainbow. That took ages!"

With a market that includes Guelph, Hillsburgh and Georgetown as well as Erln it's likely that The Paintbox will be a going concern for a few summers to come.

Counting chickens summer venture

When it somes to chickens David Milne has shown he's no coward. In fact the 18year-old Erin Township student has moved boldly into the world of small business with the purchase of 400 chickens.

Since getting the chickens in May David has been busy keeping track of growth rates and feeding as well as making arrangements for their sale to area residents.

"I feel my chickens will be a much better value than most poultry purchased in a store," says David, "As they are not stacked up on top of each other or force fed as is often the case in commercial operations."

The chickens remained on the Milne farm until September when they go to market.

Seniors' grant forms are mailed

The Ontario Ministry of Revenue is set to go with the mailing of 1984 property tax grant applications to some 612,000 senior citizen households throughout the province. Applications were mailed Friday, August 31 to seniors who have in the past been eligible for the grant. An interim installment, equal to one-half

of the 1983 property tax grant entitlement, was mailed to these eligible seniors last May. Once completed applications have been received and processed by Revenue, the Ministry will begin mailing the final instalment cheques on October 26.

The maximum annual property tax grant is \$500 per household.

Anyone who turned 65 before July will receive a property tax grant application this month. People who turn 65 in the last half of the year will be mailed applications by January of 1985. These first year recipients

will receive their property tax grant in one lump sum and in subsequent years will receive the grant in two instalments, one in the spring and one in the fall.

"In all, we are sending out over 600,000 property tax grant applications this fall," says Bud Gregory, Ontario's Revenue Minister, "to help offset the property and school taxes paid by our seniors. Again this year, as in the past, our emphasis is on accuracy. We want seniors to take their time and fill their applications out carefully".

The deadline for filling a 1984 property tax grant application is December 31, 1985.
