

Chargers claim boys crown

The school sports season got off to a flying start last week as teams from six area public schools competed for honors in the annual North Halton 3-Pitch Championships.

When the dust cleared the host Georgetown schools emerged victorious with the Stewarttown Girls claiming their first title since 1971 while Centennial boys' squad finished the competition undefeated. Other schools looking for titles included W.I. Dick and Sam Sharratt of Milton, McKenzie-Smith of Acton and Brookville.

In the girls' competition Stewarttown met little competition finishing first in their round robin division after defeating W.I. Dick 30-4 and Brookville 20-11. In the semifinals McKenzie-Smith of Acton were no match. McKenzie-Smith finished second to Centennial in their pool but fell 45-5 to Slewarttown.

Centennial provided the competition for Stewarttown in the final, falling 33-9. To get there they disposed of Mckenzie-Smith 21-4 and Sharatt 36-11, then topped Brookville 37-5 in the semis.

Centennial's boys proved too tough for the competition, downing a tough Brookville side, 15-6, for the title.

Centennial topped their pool with a 2-0 record. They topped McKenzie-Smlth 23-5 and Sharratt 19-7 to advance to the semifinal where they ousted W.I. Dick 17-7.

Brookville reached the finals undefeated but with much closer scores. The rural squad topped W.I. Dick 6-3 in their opening game then advanced to the semi's with a 9-6 win over Stewarttown. In semi-final action Brookville handled McKenzie-Smith 16-5.
