### No gas rate hike

Here's good news. Union Gas Ltd. has advised the Ontario Energy Board that it will not seek a rate increase during 1985, but will cover higher operating cost through its own financial restraint program and revenues from increased natural gas sales. It's the second consecutive year Union failed to raise rates, council learned Monday night.
