Meeting Tuesday on tourism study

Halton Region will set up an information centre about its newly-launched tourism study next Tuesday night at Acton High School.

Members of the public are invited to visit the centre, open 7.30 to 10 p.m., at which Halton's business development acting director Brent Kearsse will outline the study's goals. Representatives of Peter Barnard Associates, the consulting firm conducting the study, will add details and an open discussion is planned.

The Acton meeting, the only one being held in

Halton Hills, is the third in a series of sessions slated for Halton.

The region hopes to identify existing tourism in the area, identify opportunities and means of developing our tourism industry further and develop a three-phase implementation program.

Local people on the tourism co-ordinating committee include olde Hide House co-owner Steve Dawkins, representing the North Halton Tourism Association, Town clerk-administrator Ken Richardson and Regional chairman Pete Pomeroy.

Town flags on order

You, too, can be a standard-bearer for the Town of Halton Hills now that council is arranging to purchase flags with the Town's "badge" and colors featured on them.

General committee Monday night recommended buying 38 silk-screened versions of the otherwise hand-made flags from Kennedy Flags in Erin at a cost of \$1,368. Each would measure three by six feet.

The committee also wants \$1,500 budgetted next year to buy an undetermined number of 18 by 36-inch flags.

All are available at cost to interested buyers.

Councillors were happy to be making the purchase, although Marilyn Serjeantson expressed disappointment over a change in shade between the original, hand-made flags bought by the Town and those being acquired for the public. She asked why the new flags seem to be a "Royal blue" when the original ones featured a "lighter blue."

Serjeantson also said she'd heard complaints that the use of the words "Town of Halton Hills" on the flag seem inappropriate.

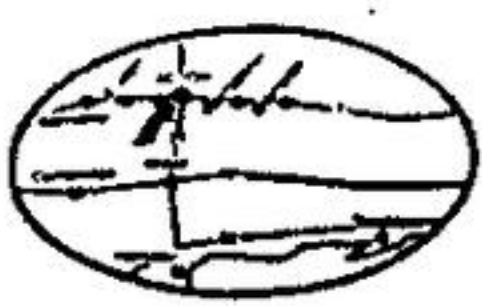

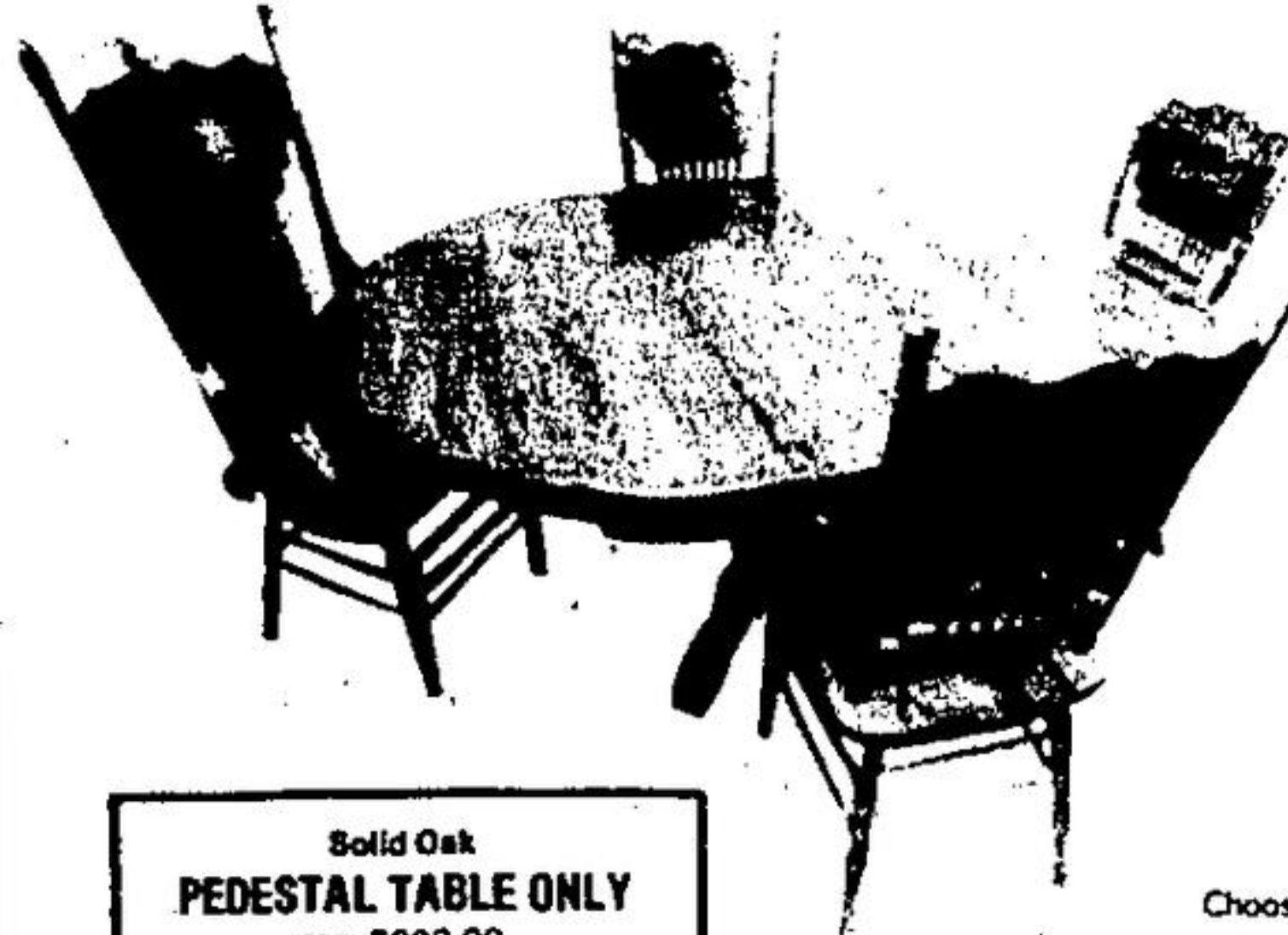

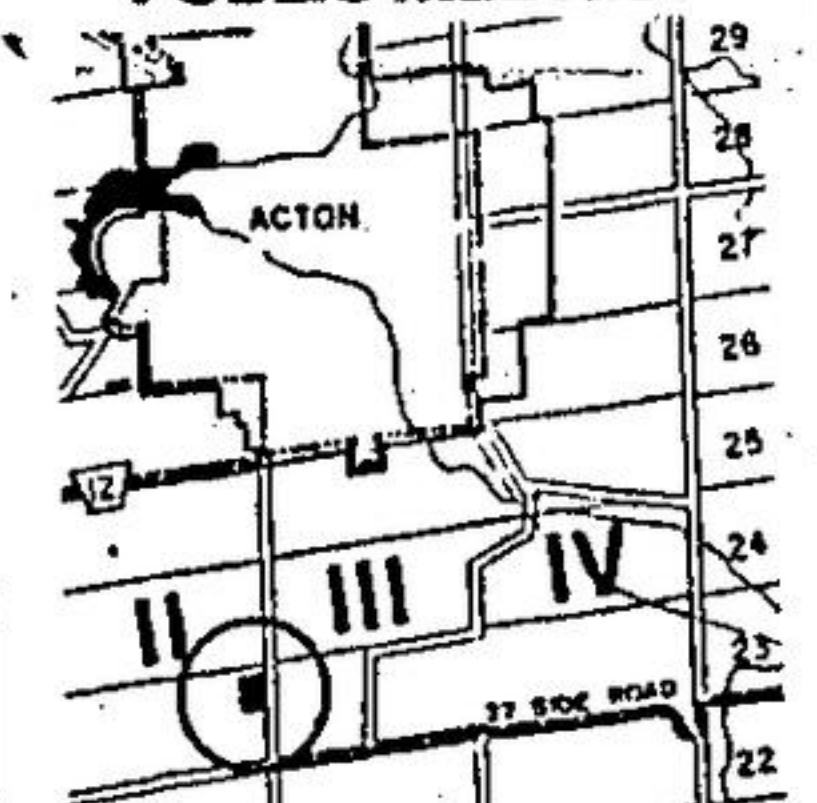
