Bridges unsafe

Following a Wellington County study on area bridges, Eramosa council was informed last Tuesday that several bridges, including one that may be owned by the township, will have new load limits placed on them because of deterioration.

Councillor Don DeLaporte remarked that he hoped township snowplows and graders could safely use the bridges in question until repairs are made.

New map

After 78 years, Rockwood will be getting a new reference map.

Council decided last Tuesday night to have Dryden and Smith Planning Consultants prepare the map, which will include street names, floodplains, zoning, rivers, lot numbers and railways.

Eramosa clerk Lloyd Hindley said the original map, made in 1906, has remained virtually unchanged for 78 years and the map, which will cost the township \$2,421, will take two weeks to complete.

Hot water

Eurozentra Investments is in hot water with Eramosa Township.

Council discussed the firm's reluctance to remove stumps and rubble from the road allowance at Lot 31, Concession 4 as requested.

Council asked Eurozentra several times to clean up the mess, which has generated complaints from several area residents.

Council will inform Eurozentra that if the situation is not corrected, the township will clear the debris and bill the company.

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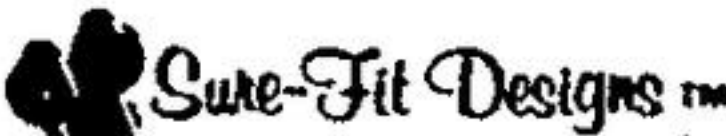
