### **Amount of** hydro hike is still uncertain

Halton Hills Hydro consumers will have to dig deeper into their pockets in 1985 but how much will remain a mystery until the new year.

Following acceptance of the Ontario energy board's recommendation of an 8.6 per cent increasesby Ontario Hydro, the Halton Hills commission will have to review their books to decide how much of that increase will be passed on to local customers, hydro commission chairman Murt Allison ваув.

Ontario Hydro had initially asked for a 9,1 per cent increase which would mean an additional \$3 per month would be incurred by the average residential customers using 850 kilowatt hours of power said Ontario Hydro public relations officer Jim Dunn.

The 1985 increases followed an 8 per cent increase last year and a 9.6 per cent increase in 1982.
