Police reachnew contract

The Halton Regional Police Commission. has approved a 1984 wage contract which will provide its member officers with a five per cent pay hike.

The new wage increase which was ratified by the Halton Police Association 10 days ago, includes wage and benefit increases amounting to \$13 million over 1984.

The commission agreed to the full five per cent allowed by provincial wage controls set last year because the policemen 'deserved it', said police commissioner James Grieve. Under the new contract the annual salary

for a first class constable will be \$32,850. A sergeant will make \$35,680 and a staff sergeant \$39,000.

Improvements in the benefits will include additional dental coverage and those with 17 years of service will now be eligible for five weeks paid vacation. Prior to this contract

officers were required to work 19 years before receiving five weeks off.

The Halton Force has 187 first class constables, 42 sergeants and 24 staff sergeants in its employ.

In addition there are 103 civilian employees who will also receive a five per cent wage increase and improvements in their benefit plans.

The only police personnel to miss any increase will be new police cadets.

In 1982 young cadets beginning their police career were earning \$15,670. Last year they received a five per cent increase, giving cadets \$16,453.50 but this year that amount has been frozen said Diane Webb, member of the bargaining committee representing the association's 390 members.

The latest wage hike will make Halton police officers the 11th highest paid police force in the province.

Labour aid for farmers

Unemployed youth and farmers will both benefit from a new program to begin Mon. Nov. 19.

The Winter Agricrew program, like the summer program, will provide employment experience for youth and temporary labour for farmers. Work crews of two or four members will be available for up to five days to farmers at a cost of \$50 and \$90 a day respectively.

Eligible youth must be between the ages of 15 and 24, out of work for 12 weeks or more and have no more than a Grade 12 educa-

tion. The program will utilize 66 young people in Ontario.

Robert McLeod is currently taking bookings from those interested in hiring crews during the 17-week program. He is Agricrew coordinator for this and five other regions and is stationed at the Alliston agricultural office (705) 435-5521.
