# Weapon industries are not productive

Military production is bad business according to Janet Duvall and she just doesn't mean in the emotional sense.

Duvall, a member of the Halton Hills Action for Nuclear Disarmament told Georgetown's University Women's Club Tuesday night that building nuclear weapons does not make good economic sense.

Japan and West Germany, for instance, are not allowed to manufacture weapons but they are the most productive countries in the world, Duvall says. The United States and the United Kingdom, on the other hand, have the largest military industries yet they are the least productive of the major economic countries.

The United States, for example, spends a half a billion dollars a year on military production creating approximately 20,000 jobs, she says. If this money was spent in the health and education sectors, twice as many jobs could be created. The tooling up and exorbitant salaries account for the high cost of military production.

Canada is not much better off, Duvall says. This country has a defense production sharing agreement with the United States. Canada is allowed to build components for American military equipment but only if Canada agrees to buy from the United States an equivalent dollar amount of military equipment. This negates any benefit to our economy, Duvall says.

The federal government also gave grants to Canadian industries to tool up, amounting to as much as \$60,000 in taxes for every job created, Duvail says. At the same time the spin-off from these industries is limited.

Duvall told the audience she does not see the logic in building more weapons. Only a couple bombs are needed to completely destroy the other side yet the United States has 30,000 bombs and the USSR has 20,000 she says.

There is another way to control the world which the USSR is currently pursuing, Duvail says. It is called power by influence. There are now 100,000 Third World students studying at Soviet universities receiving Communist philosophy. The Soviets are also providing major financial and health care help in these developing countries.




