**Patchett hearing set**

Thomas Edward Patchett of Erin Township, charged with second degree murder of his son, will appear in Provincial Court Jan. 30 for a preliminary hearing.

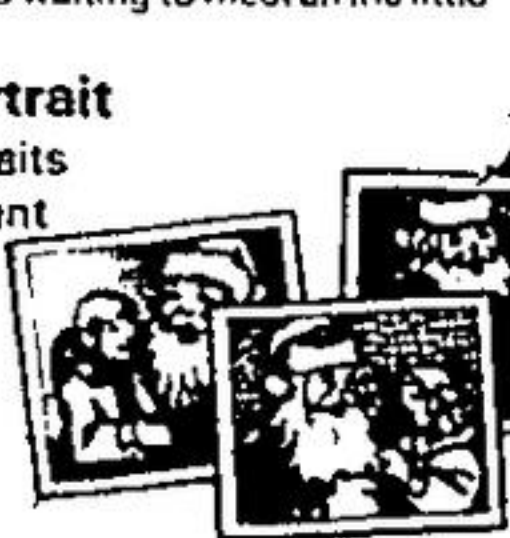
