



> QUICK TURKEY CRUNCH

1 (10% ounce) can cream of mushroom soup 14 cup water Spred 1/2 can noodles on the bottom of an 8

inch square buttered cake dish. Combine other ingredients; spread mix-

ture over noodles. Sprinkle remaining noodles over the top.

Bale at 350 degrees F. for 30-40 minutes in a conventional oven or 8-10 minutes at medium high power in a microwave oven. Serves 4-6.

EASY TURKEY LOAF

4 eggs, beaten 25 cup milk 1 cup soft bread crumbs 2 tablespoons chopped green pepper Z tablespoons chopped pimento 1 small onlon, chopped 11/2 teaspoons parsley flakes

1/4 teaspoon poultry seasoning 2 tablespoons butter, melted 3 cups cubed turkey 1/4 cup chopped green olives (optional)

Combine all ingredients.

Pour into a I quart loaf pan. Bake at 325 degrees F. for 45-60 minutes in a conventional oven or 12-15 minutes at medium power in a microwave oven. Serves 4-6.

TURKEY SALAD GOURMET

3 cups shredded lettuce 2 cups fresh spinach leaves 2 medium tomatoes, quartered 2 cups cubed turkey

2 tablespoons honey 1 teaspoon curry powder 1/2 teaspoon gartic salt 54 teaspoon pepper 12 cup sliced almonds Arrange lettuce, spinach, and tomatoes in 2 quart casserole dish. Combine other ingredients and spoon onto bed of greens. Serve 6-8.
