**Leftover turkey recipes**

**1 cup diced celery**  
5 tablespoons lemon juice  
2 tablespoons honey  
1 teaspoon curry powder  
1/2 teaspoon garlic salt  
1/4 teaspoon pepper  
1/2 cup sliced almonds

Arrange lettuce, spinach, and tomatoes in 2 quart casserole dish.  
Combine other ingredients and spoon onto bed of greens.  
Serve 6-8.

**QUICK TURKEY CRUNCH**

1 (5 ounce) can chow mein noodles  
1 (8 ounce) can water chestnuts, sliced  
1 medium onion  
1/2 cup sliced celery  
1 cup diced turkey  
1 (10 1/2 ounce) can cream of mushroom soup  
1/4 cup water

Spread 1/2 can noodles on the bottom of an 8 inch square buttered cake dish.  
Combine other ingredients; spread mixture over noodles.  
Sprinkle remaining noodles over the top.  
Bake at 350 degrees F. for 30-40 minutes in a conventional oven or 8-10 minutes at medium high power in a microwave oven.  
Serves 4-6.

**EASY TURKEY LOAF**

4 eggs, beaten  
3/4 cup milk  
1 cup soft bread crumbs  
2 tablespoons chopped green pepper  
2 tablespoons chopped pimento  
1 small onion, chopped  
1 1/2 teaspoons parsley flakes  
1/4 teaspoon poultry seasoning  
2 tablespoons butter, melted  
3 cups cubed turkey  
1/4 cup chopped green olives (optional)

Combine all ingredients.  
Pour into a 1 quart loaf pan.  
Bake at 325 degrees F. for 45-60 minutes in a conventional oven or 12-15 minutes at medium power in a microwave oven.  
Serves 4-6.

3 cups shredded lettuce  
2 cups fresh spinach leaves  
2 medium tomatoes, quartered  
2 cups cubed turkey

## Irish Yule music brings out spirits

Christmas time in Ireland is symbolized by music—music that goes far beyond the traditional Christmas carol as we know it.

Musical historians can trace the evolution of Irish holiday music back several centuries. For example, in the 17th century, itinerant harpists traveled around the country, composing songs for the great families of the day in return for their hospitality.

At Christmas and other occasions such as weddings and funerals, the harpists would be rewarded with an even greater abundance of whiskey and good cheer.


One of the most celebrated harpists was the blind musician and composer Turlough Carolan, who was born in County Meath in 1670. Carolan, according to his biographers, excelled in joyful music.

On his harp, he would compose songs that reflect the merriment of the holiday season: Him, jam, planxty, merriment, Sing, dance, drink his health about.

Carolan's favorite subject was drinking, and it was one he researched personally whenever he could. So, it's very appropriate that a new Irish cream liqueur—a delicious combination of double cream, Irish whiskey and honey—has been named after him.
