RECIPE OF THE WEEK

TURKEY OR CHICKEN CASSEROLE WITH VEGETABLES

Melt 3 tbsp. butter. Stir in and saute gently until lightly browned:
1/2 cup diced celery
1/2 cup thinly sliced onion
1/2 cup thinly sliced green pepper

Sprinkle over top and cook slowly for 5 minutes:
3 tbsp. flour

Stir in gradually 1 1/2 cups turkey or chicken stock. Remove from heat. Stir in 2 lightly beaten egg yolks, salt and pepper to taste, and add 2 cups cubed turkey or chicken. Stir over low heat just long enough to thicken sauce slightly. You may add 3 tbsp. white wine. Place in casserole. Sprinkle with minced chives or parsley, or cheese.
