Funeral service was held on Friday at the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home for Mary Ann (May) Thompson, 87, who died at the Halton Centennial Manor on Dec. 30.

Consider 'Brush-Ins' For School Pupils

Whether or not pupils in Georgetown schools will be having their own "brush-ins" is something that Halton County Health Unit will decide after weighing the reaction to an experimental group toothbrushing session last week.

In the experiments, grades six, seven and eight at Robert Little School in Acton participated in a unique trial dental health project, brushing their teeth with a special type of fluoride toothpaste containing a stain removing ingredient.

SPECIAL TOOTHPASTE
They brushed under the guidance of Mrs. Mary Ludzik and assistant Mrs. Cindy Asselin of the Health Unit.

Tooth brushes and paste were provided by the Health Unit and students brushed their teeth in groups according to Mrs. Ludzik's instructions. The special tooth paste is similar to that used by dentists to polish teeth.

One draw back to group applications of fluoride and cleanser is the expense involved. The special paste is costly, and each school child is given their own brush.
