

Special Ceremony Marks Guiding Diamond Jubilee

Georgetown South District Guides and Brownies with their leaders held a special meeting marking the Diamond Jubilee birthday party of Guiding in Canada on Wednesday in Knox Church Hall.

After listening to the 'salute to guiding' radio broadcast, Guides and Brownies clasped hands together "each of us a link to make a golden chain — each of us can forge it with friendship in service" and all together reaffirmed their promise as Guides and Brownies.

The radio message began

"Tonight we salute the three hundred thousand Girl Guides in Canada who are marking their Diamond Jubilee across the nation. Let us join them as they clasp hands to honour their 80 years of service to Canadian girls, and wish them many more years of fun, fellowship and service. In her own way each girl will be using her time to reaffirm the promise she made at her enrolment."

Brownie Promise: I promise to do my best; to do my duty to God, Queen and my country; to help other people every day, especially those at home.

Guide Promise: I promise on my honour to do my best; to do my duty to God, the Queen and my country, to help other people at all times and to obey the Guide law.

Gloria Hildebrandt of 4th Guide Company, gave a short history of Guiding in Canada. Canada's first Girl Guide Company was founded in St. Catharines in 1910 with 21 members. Today Canadian Guiding has members in every province, the Yukon, Northwest Territories.

A display of badges of earlier years was mounted

on the bulletin board and Guides and Brownies had a chance to see these and compare them to their 1970 badges as they marched around to form a Campfire Circle.

When everyone was in place the lights were dimmed and 10 Guides of the 4th Company performed the Campfire Lighting ceremony using the Guide laws as done by Girl Guides in India.

All then joined enthusiastically in singing a variety of Guide and Brownie songs. The evening closed with the serving of individual birthday cakes.
