\$400,000 School Surplus Last Year

Halton municipalities will be dividing up a \$400,000 credit toward their education levies for 1970.

In a review of the board's 1969 budget, it was announced a \$400,000 surplus was realized.

The board must end the fiscal year with a zero balance to comply with provincial regulations.

The amounts, to be returned through credit on 1970 levies, will be determined by the Ontario Municipal Board on the same basis as contributions were made for the 1969 school year.
