day went scoreless. With 8:09 left in the second period Orillia's Lutes broke the spell with help from Bailey. The period ended 1-0.

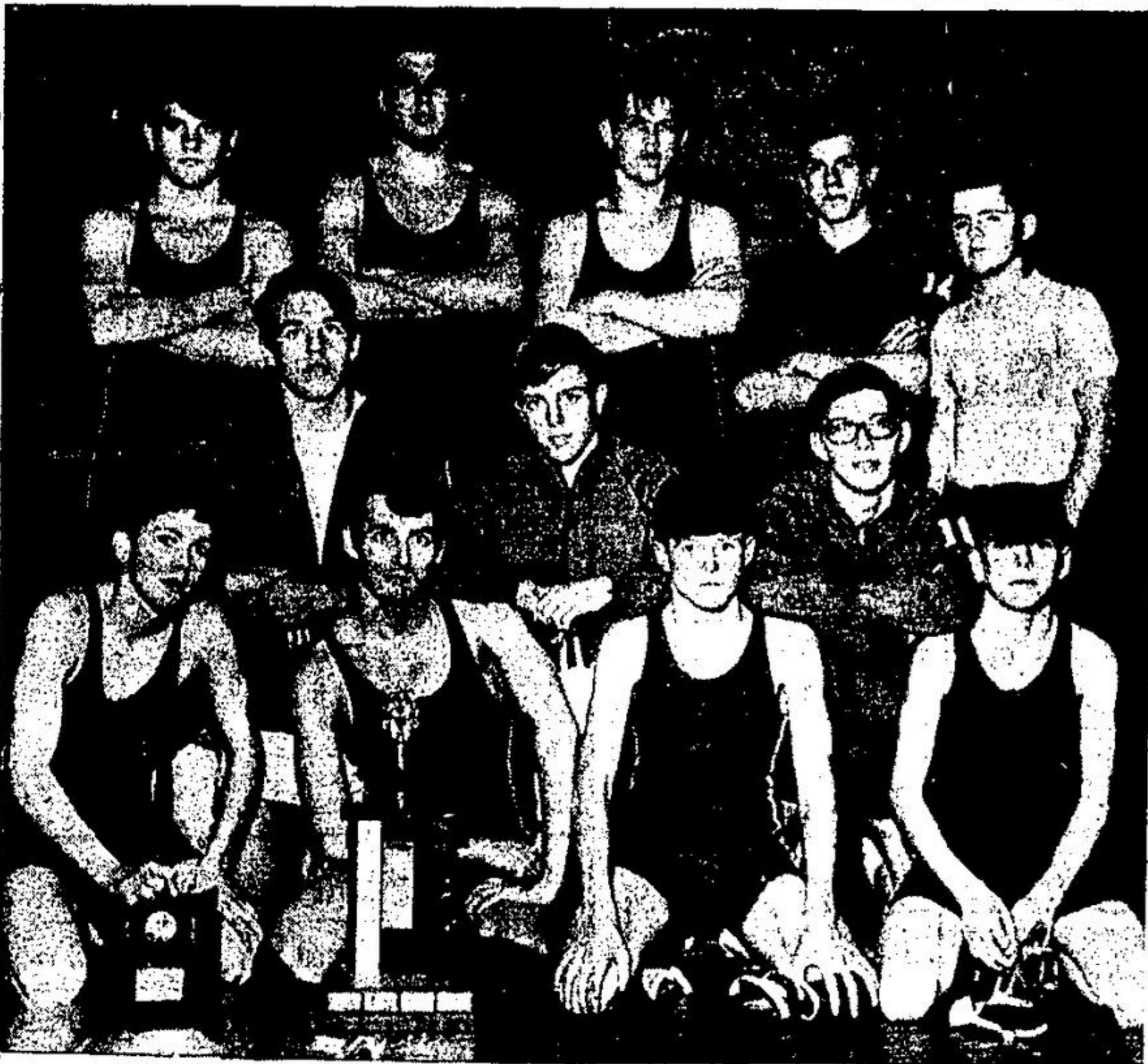
