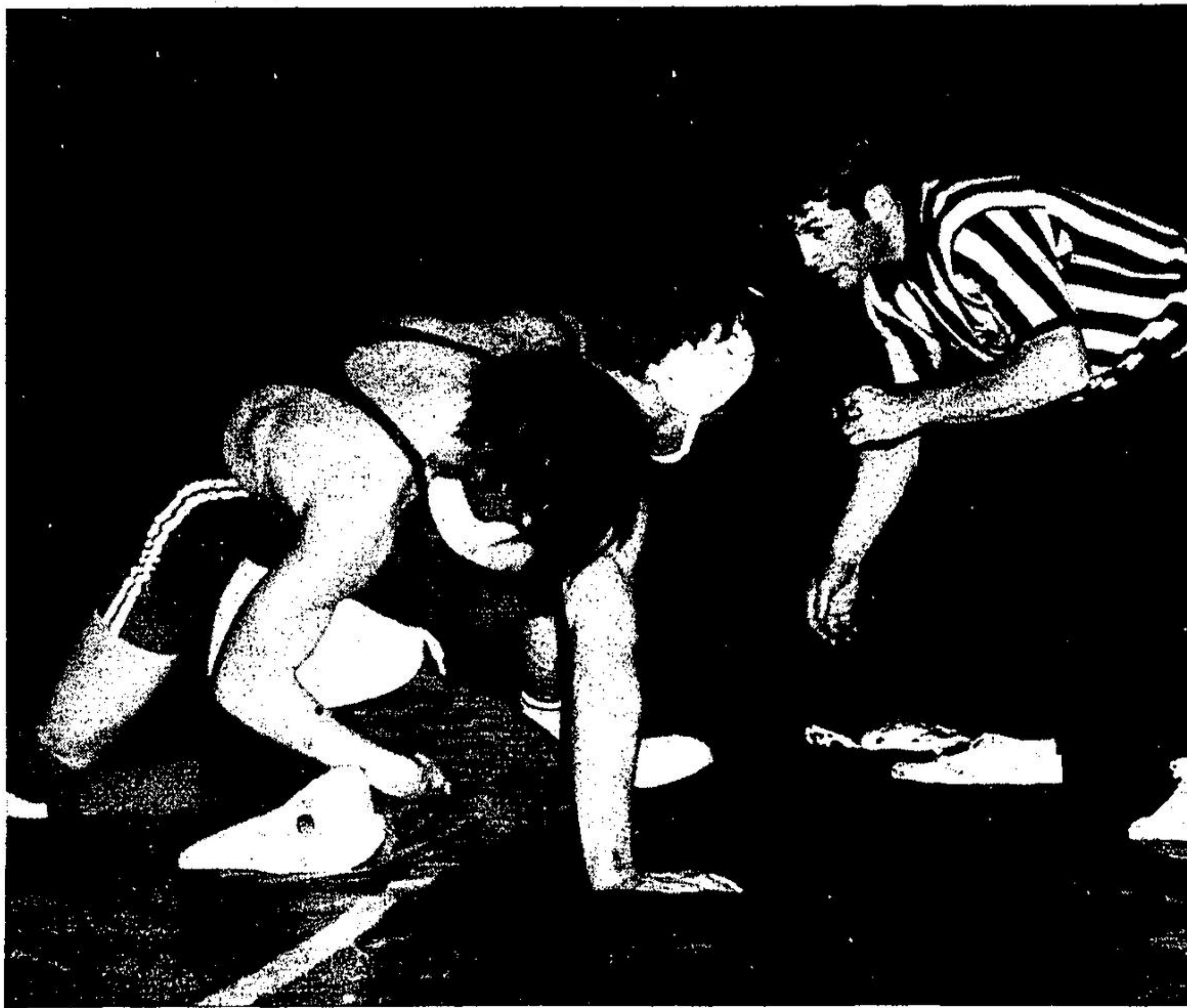

The E. W. Bliss Co., on Guelph Street have landed a \$600,000 order for a synchronized traffic light system for the city of Guatemala. The order will be filled at the local plant a member company of Gulf-Western.

Oscar Alvarez Beteta, Latin American representative in Canada for the first time, pointed out that Guatemala City has a population of over one million. He stated the contract was signed with the government of Guatemala on December 6, 1969.
