**LET'S GANG UP ON KILLER CROW**  
Out in Saskatchewan they say — Murder is his business.

One crow that has not ended the battle against predators, such as the crow. This black, feathered waterfowl murderer destroys millions of wild duck eggs every year on the great duck nesting range in western Canada.

Killer crow, next to drought, and early-season floods, does the heaviest damage in Canada's big duck factory (where most North American ducks breed).

Ducks Unlimited, the American duck hunters' non-profit organization, founded years ago to restore wasted waterfowl nesting areas and maintain them in the Dominion's vast west, must fight drought, floods, marsh fires and predators like the crow, to help ducks coming to you.

Remember that the crow is a migratory bird which ranges all over the nation from Texas to the vast Canadian duck breeding grounds. The crow that you blast out of existence today, you can rest assured will never get back to the north country to menace the future of your duck hunting through his greedy predations.

● Eighteen residents of Moore Township living adjacent to the Goodfellow Waste Disposal Plant had their assessment reduced \$500, a letter from the clerk of the township informed Esqueusing council, Monday night.

The reduction was due to their proximity to the plant; Goodfellow Enterprises are seeking permission to build a similar plant in Esqueusing.

● A letter from H. J. Molis en objected to the operation of a dragstrip at Lot 26 Con. 6, claiming it would be noisy, produce vandalism in the area and reduce property values. He objected similarly to the go-kart track near Limehouse.

● Fifteen additional street lights, and six replacements are needed in Glen Williams according to a report of the Georgetown hydro.
