**GOLD CORN IS WORTH GOLD WATCH**

Halton Soil and Crop Improvement directors met on March 25th to plan projects for the coming season.

This year a high yield competition will be held for grain corn and spring grains in combination with a crop costs study. A gold watch will be awarded to the winner of the competition with the highest number of entries plus other awards. A bus tour is planned for July 15th with one of the stops being Ontario Drainage Day in Haldimand County.

Weed control trials are to be conducted on corn comparing Lasso, Sutan, Atrazine and Bladex. Possible cash crops for Halton are also to be encouraged — such crops as flax and peas.
