Christian Principles Exemplified

A long time ago a certain wise man wrote "Like arrows in the hands of a warrior are the sons of one's youth. Happy is the man with a quiver full of them?" There are people today who would take issue with that statement. They would say that large families are more of a liability than a blessing. And there may be a good case for that opinion in today's over-populated world.

When we speak of God to a young boy whose father has deserted the family, or whose parents are divorced . . . when we speak of God as a loving father, the boy is likely to get a pretty poor impression of what God is like. It can be most difficult, then, when confronted with a fatherless boy, to convey to him the image of God as a father who their employees into strike earned her performer's diplo- is truly interested in him and who loves him.

> The world is full of fatherless boys . . . many without mothers as well. For some of us it is fairly easy to 'adopt' a child under the Foster Parent Plan or through some other agency, and to spend a little money for all his support. It is quite another matter when we consider supporting a child in our own community, supporting him by personal contact and involvement. There are fatherless boys in our own area who need some mature man to give them love and companionship. And one of the channels through which this may be done is the Big Brothers of Canada Association. These men act as elder brothers to fatherless boys. They don't attempt to take the place of father, but they are pledged to give male companionship as well as moral. ethical, and, hopefully, Christian guidance and direction to the Little Brother.

What prompts a man to become Big Brother? There are many reasons, perhaps he has no son of his own and a Little Brother can fill this need in his life. Or, because he does have a son of his own and is so grateful for this blessing he wants to bring some measure of happiness to a boy who has no dad of his own. Or perhaps he simply loves kids.

In these days when there is much talk about the 'generation gap' and when parents are wringing their hands In despair because youth is going to pot, it is good to know that there are men who apparently have not heard of these difficulties, because they are quietly going ahead communicating with youth and finding them to be wonderful people. There still appears to be a great deal of happiness or blessedness in giving . . . not necessarily money, but of self. This love and concern for a child is clearly seen in the life and teaching of Jesus, and surely this world can't be totally bad while there are men about who are trying to follow his way . . . In one manner or another.
