Eight Hurt in Flood Of Motor Accidents

A rash of automobile accidents in and around Georgetown this past week resulted in nine people suffering injuries and several thousand dollars in property damage. The accident toll was inflated by a snow-bearing wind that put a high polish on Highway 7 last Thursday.

One of the Thursday night mishaps produced three injuries. Patrick Lemoyne, of Brampton, age 34 suffered a head cut, Peter Lemoyne, who was driving the car, suffered an injured right knee, and Mildred Porter also of Brampton received cuts to her mouth. She was driving the second car in the collision at 6:15 p.m. on Highway 7 just west of the Chinguacousy-Esqueping Town Line.

The cars' damage amounted to \$1700.

There were three other accidents near town the same day. Eight hundred dollars was done to a car driven by Arthur Buresh of 67 Edward St. when it rolled on the 7th Line, a half mile south of Stewart town. Joseph Alexander of Draper Street escaped injury in a single car accident on the 7th Line just south of the Silvercreek corner which damaged

the car he was driving to the tune of \$400. And Ross Lambourn of 154 Rexway Drive was the driver of a car involved in an accident on Highway 7 just east of the 5th Line doing \$200 to the front end.

James Wardell of R. R. 1, Georgetown and Earl Johnson

of R. R. 2, Laurel were the drivers of cars which collided on Highway 7 north of the Limehouse sideroad, Tuesday afternoon. Johnson received minor lacerations to his head. Property damage totalled \$1,250.
