

\$470,000 Ontario Grant Final Payment on Manor

FOUR BEING BUILT

There are 78 Homes for the Aged in the Province of Ontario. Three of these were opened last year and four new homes are now under construction.

Choose Bikes With Care Train Children in Use

Bikes and tricycles will soon be reappearing on town streets and sidewalks with the advent of warm weather.

Watch out for young cyclists. They'll be a little wobbly after not using their bicycles all winter and many of them will be inexperienced learners.

1. The left arm out and up for a right turn... out straight for a left turn... out and down for a stop.

2. After signalling return your left hand to the handle bar promptly... and keep both hands on the handle bars.

Parents of bicyclists should make sure their youngster's bike is in good mechanical condition... good brakes, steering and tires. If the bicycle is used after dark, it must also be equipped with a white or amber front light, a red reflector or light on the rear, red reflective material at least 10 inches long and one inch wide on the front forks.

If you're buying a bicycle for your youngster, don't make the mistake of buying him one he must grow up to. A bicycle too big for a small child is a real accident hazard. It's easier for a youngster to accommodate himself to a small bicycle than to try to handle one that is too large.

3. Ride in single file, close to the curb.

4. At busy intersections, stop at the curb, get off your bike and walk it across. At stop lights walk your bike across only on the green signal.

5. Walk your bike when you're on a sidewalk. Only very small children with sidewalk bikes may use the walks for riding.

6. Carry parcels in a carrier... not in your hand.

7. A regulation bike is for one rider... no passengers allowed.

Does your child know the bicycle rules of the road? These tips will help him to be a safer cyclist.

MUST HAVE

"We can't get together on a price," he said. "We need 20 feet on the west side of the property farthest from the river, and must have this as soon as possible for the project."

Cr. Ern Hyde said council must support the appraisal or it would weaken the town's bargaining position in future easements.

NOT THE PLACE

"If we have objections this isn't the place to discuss them," he said.

In a recorded vote, Reeve Wm. F. Hunter voted against the expropriation move.

Later in the meeting, an old expropriation action was ended with a payment of \$11,100 voted to the Petrofina firm. This was for land acquired for highway widening at the Mountainview and Guelph St. corner.




