**Stupid? Him, Not Us Hyde Blasts Dodokin**

"I object to being called stupid by someone who is too stupid to make a survey and understand the facts he's writing about," stormed Cr. Ern Hyde at Monday's council meeting.

Mr. Hyde had levelled his heavy ammunition at Ron Dodokin, president of Park Parent School association. In a letter in last week's Herald, Mr. Dodokin disagreed with council's action in the initiating of a 3-way stop at Charles and Church Streets, and insisted that a crossing guard at Charles and Park Avenue is the only way of ensuring school children's safety.

Mr. Hyde said police, engineering department and school board had made the recommendation to council and had said there is no need for a crossing guard.

"Council accepted the fact there is a problem and we investigated the 3-way stop. It has served its purpose in stowing traffic," he said.
