**Township Millrate Both Up and Down**

The mill rate in Esqueping is both slightly up and slightly down, depending in which area you live.

In the Georgetown area where the fire area rate has not yet been set, the mill rate at the moment is down 1.88, but this may not last when the fire area is added.

It's a firm figure in the other high school areas, however. Acton area has gone up 2.28 mills, from 60.82 to 63.10. Milton area has increased 1.55 mills, from 60.17 to 61.72.

For residents of Glen Williams, Norval and Stewarttown the street lighting costs must be added. These are Glen Williams 1.5 mills, up .3; Norval 2.5 mills up 1.3; and Stewarttown 1.1 mills, down 1.4.

The high school rates for this year only, have reverted to different rates for Acton, Milton and Georgetown, in order to pick up deficits and distribute surpluses, accumulated before the establishment of the Halton County Board of Education.

Next year the rates for education should again be uniform all over the township.

The residential property rebate will further soften the tax blow.

**Plaza Neighbours Complain of Garbage**

Piles of garbage and lack of a fence at the Moore Park Plaza brought Robert James, and five neighbours from Heather Court, to council Monday night.

Mr James told of garbage blowing all over the gardens of adjoining neighbours. He asked council if they could force the plaza owners to erect a fence. He related an incident where a car was parked with its engine running, ran across the gardens and into a wall of a house. "A fence would have prevented this," he pointed out.

**PLAY THINGS**

He told of a pile of cement blocks 5 to 6 feet high being left there and now being used as children's play things. "They are being thrown onto the gardens where new trees have been planted," he stated.

The mayor told of many attempts to have this situation cleaned up, but with no success, since the plaza owners do not reply to the letters. "Our solicitor says we have no authority to make them erect a fence," said the mayor. "However, we can enforce the garbage by-law."

**PRESSURE**

He pointed out that some pressure could be exerted when they asked for release of the rest of the land.

Cr. Ern Hyde contended the untidiness rests with the store owners. "You people around there can do something about that!" he suggested. He pointed out that the new official plan calls for fencing of commercial areas where they abut residential areas.

Cr. Hyde wanted to stress the fact the Texaco station is not included in the unsightly area. "It is one of the cleanest and neatest service stations anywhere," he added.
