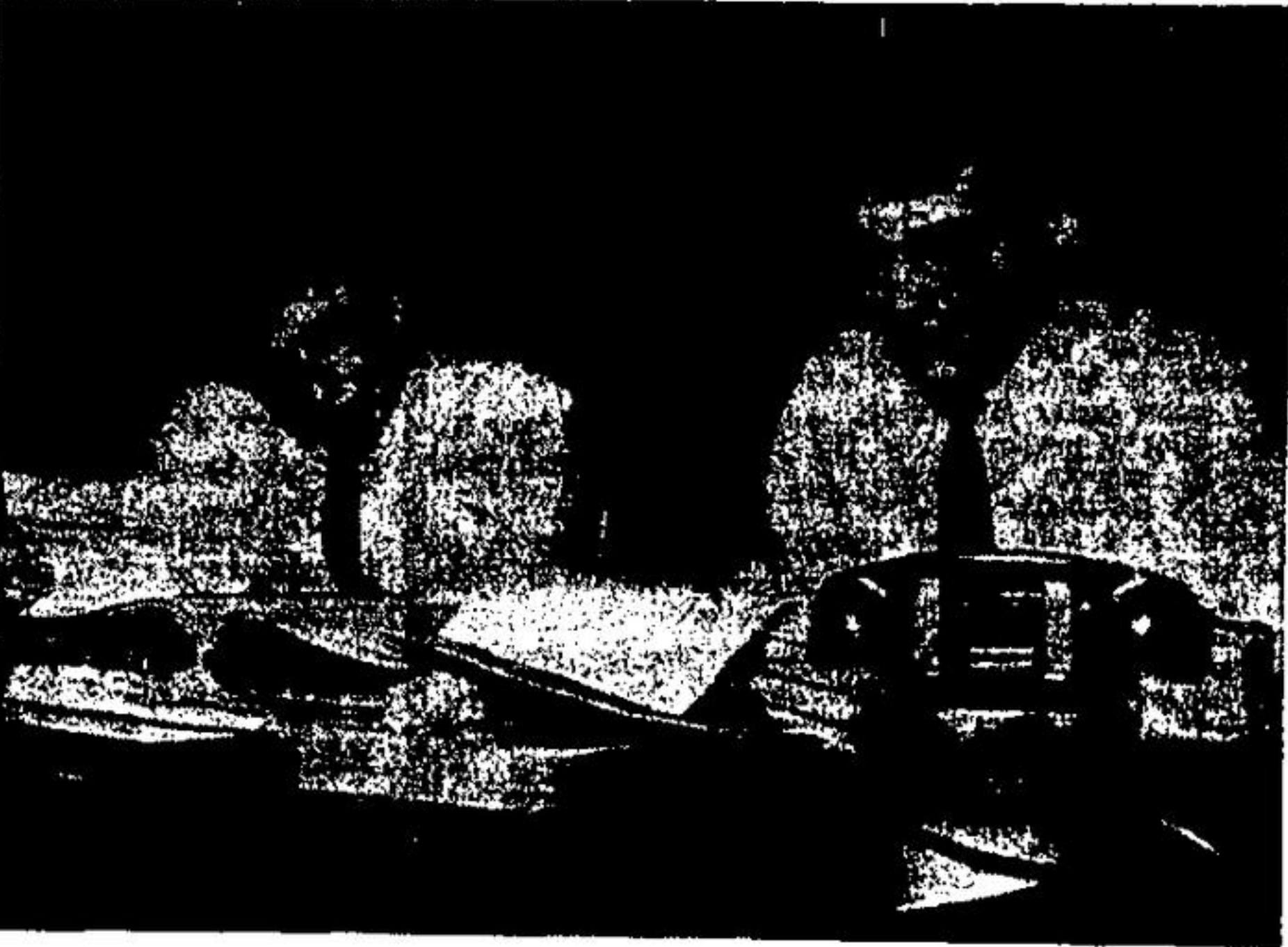
We are pleased to report that Bill Korzak is able to be home after having heart surgery in Toronto Western Hospital. We wish him a speedy recovery back to his usual active life.

Deputy reeve Tom Hill claimed the whole situation may be revised after they hear from Acton Quarries.



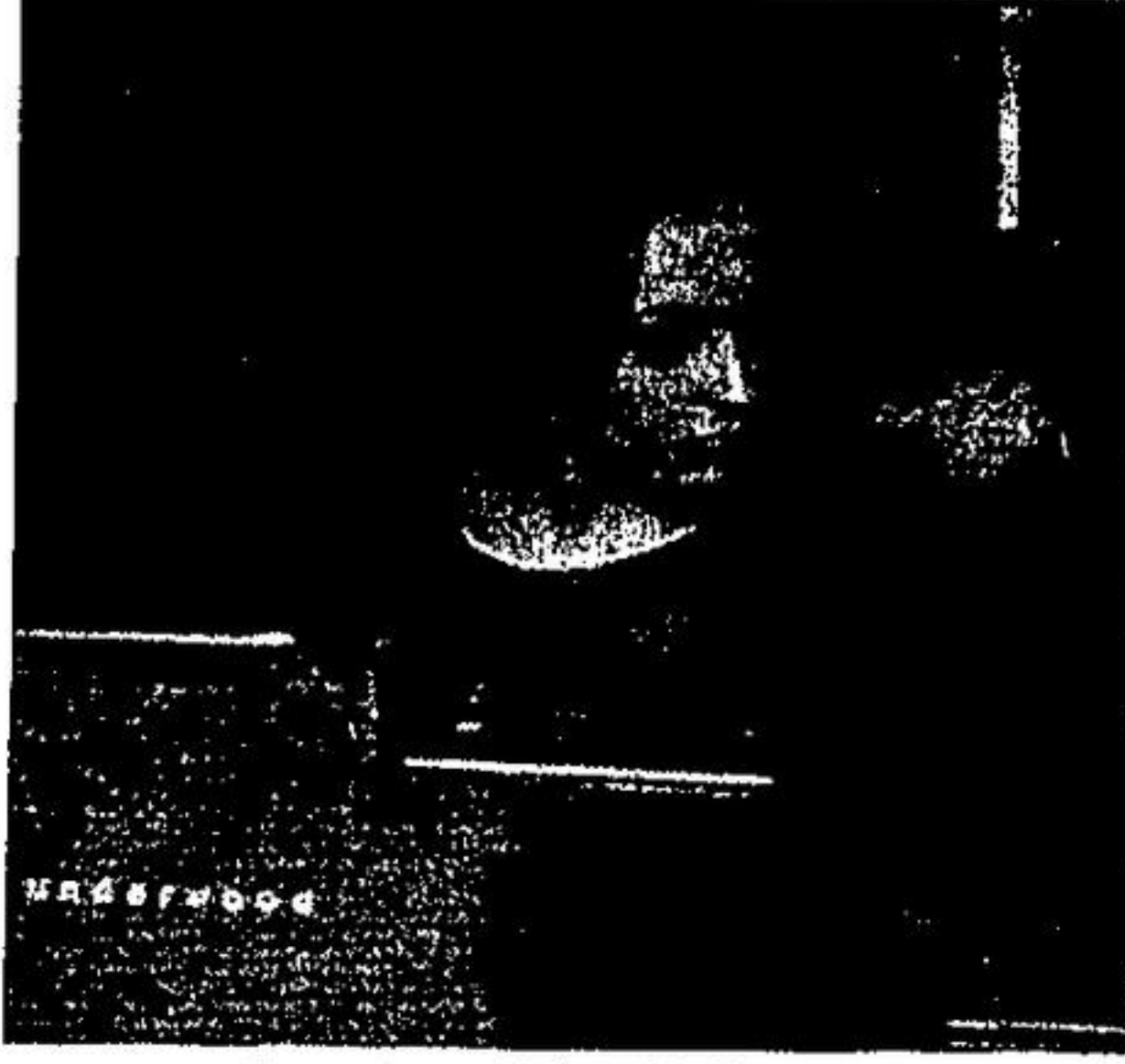
