A Georgetown woman suffered minor injuries when she was knocked down by a car at the corner of Main and Guelph Streets, Friday afternoon. Treated for scrapes to her left knee and left hand and a bump on her head was Helen Noble of 43 Victoria Street.

Parents Fear for Boy Missing Three Weeks

All area police departments have been on the lookout for a 14 year old Georgetown boy missing from his home since the first week of April.

The boy is about five feet nine inches tall, weighs about 115 pounds, has fairly long dark brown hair, brown eyes, even white teeth, a few freckles and a friendly warm personality.

The boy left for school early one morning and never returned. His mother doesn't know why he left: the only thing she can think of is that he had skipped school a couple of times and was under pressure there; and he has a twin brother who is constantly competing with him. She thinks the combination of the two might have put too much strain on him.

"We've been driving around every night and all weekend looking for him," his mother said yesterday. "We would like him to come home very much," she said.

His parents are worried that he is being harbored by someone who will lead him into harm.

ATTIC ABLAZE

Mr. and Mrs. Charles MacLeod returned to their home at 18 Edward St., April 19, to find a fire in the attic had done some interior damage in their absence. They had been at a bowling tournament at Niagara Falls.

A neighbour, Werner Kraus, noticed smoke coming from the peak of the MacLeod home at about 3 p.m. and his quick action averted a more serious fire. With the help of John MacLeod, age 12 he used fire extinguishers to keep the flames in check.

Four MacLeod children and a family were in a basement apartment when the fire occurred.
