

Red Cross Homemakers Approved for Georgetown

Agreements with Burlington, Georgetown and Oakville branches of both the Canadian Red Cross and the Victorian Order of Nurses were approved by county council Tuesday, April 28th.

The V.O.N. agreement on behalf of Halton Social and Family services calls for payment of up to \$4.50 for each visit by a nurse from the order.

PART PAYMENT

The visiting nurse service will be available to elderly, handicapped, ill or convalescent county residents where a physician certifies that the service

is necessary for the person to remain at home or to make possible his or her return home from a hospital or other institution.

The county will seek part payment from patients when possible.

REDUCE BILL

The Red Cross will furnish homemaker services with the county paying \$12 a day or \$1.50 per hour. Again, if the social and family services director believes that a recipient of public welfare assistance or pensioner is able to pay, the person will be asked to reduce the county's bill.

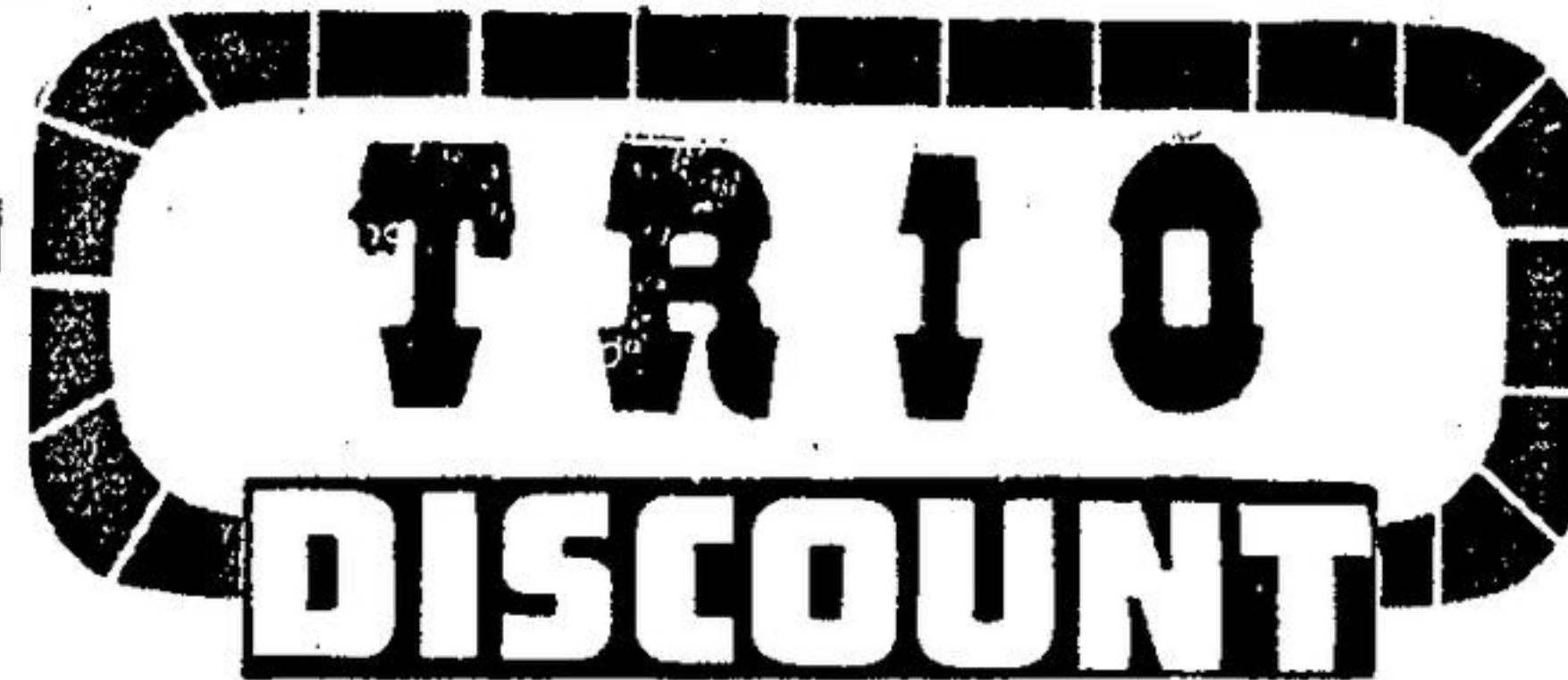
