Commend Esqueing Financial Picture

Esqueing township ended 1969 with a small deficit of \$301, according to the auditor's report issued to council last week.

While they commended all the financial operations of the township, the report singled out tax arrears as a matter of concern. As of the end of the year, there were \$262,153 or 29.8% arrears in taxes. However, Clerk Delmar French pointed out that arrears had dropped to \$102,000 by the first of May. The auditor also recommended machine bookkeeping, to speed up operations.

Wants Dragway Hours Controlled

Peter Bowman persistent opponent of the Golden Horseshoe Dragway, again asked Esqueing Council to pass some by-law controlling the hours and method of operation of the Dragway.

Backing him in his request was Dave Craig of the 4th Line, who pointed out the drag way is supposed to start operations on May 15, "If you don't move soon, it will be too late," he warned.

Bowman claimed that owner Carl Bristow's health unit permit approved a maximum four hour operation at one time, but that in the Supreme Court affidavit, Bristow had stated a maximum of 8 1/2 hours at a time.

ALL TYPES
Cr. Ken Marshall suggested council could have a by-law prepared, limiting the hours of operation. "Perhaps there would be no Sunday racing at all," he added.

Cr. Russell Miller made it clear that a by-law would apply to all types of car racing in the township, not just to one operation.

Council decided to draft some regulations, then ask the solicitor's opinion, on their regulations.
