**Urge Halton Farmers To Refuse School Taxes**

Farmers in Halton county are being urged to support a province-wide tax strike.

Denzil Lawrence, head of the Halton branch of the Ontario Federation of Agriculture, confirmed this week that plans for the tax strike are now being organized.

Lawrence said Halton will be among the counties supporting the withholding of education tax payments.

"This tax strike has been approved by the Ontario Federation of Agriculture and will be supported by Halton," said Lawrence.

**FORCE**

He said the purpose of withholding education tax payments is to force provincial government officials to overhaul its taxation structure.

Lawrence said the present system of taxation places too much emphasis on property taxes.

"The farmers simply cannot afford to exist as long as the financing of education is dependent upon property tax," said Lawrence.

He said the problem is 'particularly severe' in counties like Halton where urban areas dominate the rural community. As an example he noted that in Halton the only area to experience a tax increase this year was the rural township of Nassagaweya.

Nassagaweya officials revealed this week they are seeking a meeting with provincial cabinet ministers to appeal for relief from education costs. They claim the township assessment base is not adequate to finance its share of education spending in Halton.

In south Ontario, including Halton and Peel, will be the main areas of support for the tax strike.

Following a closed meeting last week, Gordon Hill, president of the Ontario Federation of Agriculture, said it was decided to ask farmers in the province not to pay their education taxes this year.

Hill said for the past 20 years the provincial government has been promising to overhaul its taxation system, but has not yet carried out complete reform program.
