**Half-Way House New Rehabilitation Idea**

"A recent survey shows it costs the Canadian taxpayer \$10,000 a year to keep a man in prison. Plus the cost of incarceration and prisons, the remainder is made up of police and court expenses, insurance against theft, loss of a man's wages and welfare for the convicted man's family.

Canada imprisons more men and women per capita than any other country." These statements were made by Mr. R.S.C. Williams at a meeting of St. Leonard's House (Peel).

The use of the half-way houses, like the one slated for construction shortly on Highway 7 near Dixie Road, is a major contribution in cutting down on the return percentage of convicted men. An opportunity to regain their dignity and help them make good along with a chance for employment are some of the aims of St. Leonard's (Peel).

Mr. Williams went on to say "St. Leonard's House (Peel) is the first of its type in Ontario. Many people are watching its growth carefully and awaiting its opening. Letters requesting information have come from across Canada and the United States. It is encouraging to see that being first does not necessarily mean going unnoticed and that we can be helpful to others."

In closing Mr. Williams pointed out the advantages of St. Leonard's (Peel) and what it would do for the county.

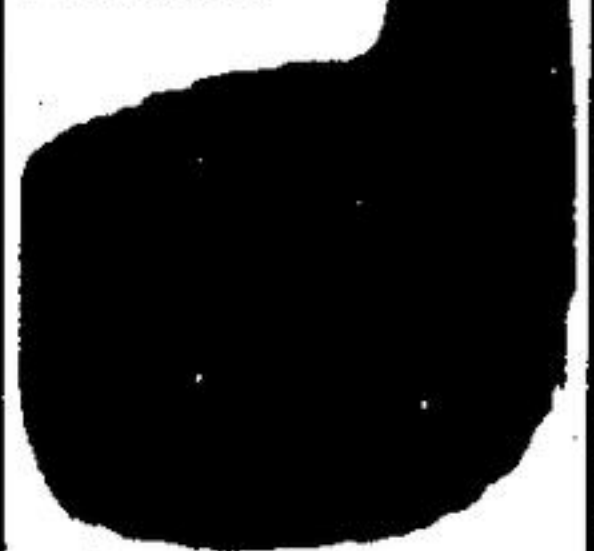

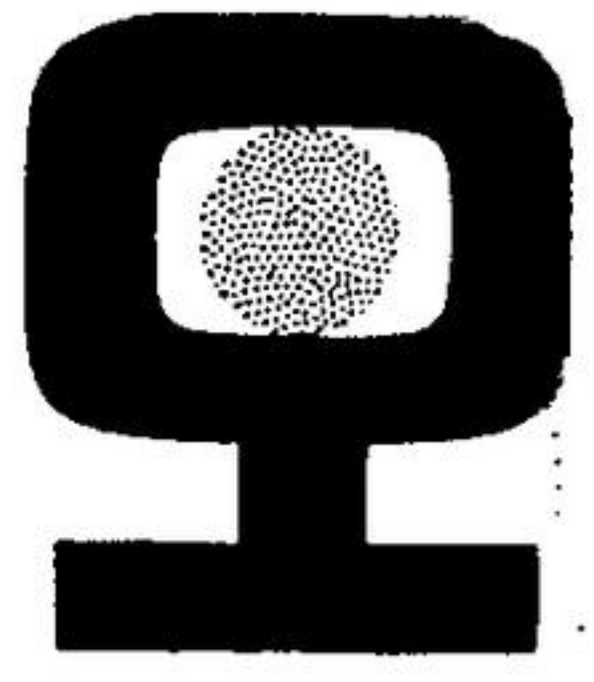
