
AUCTION ACTION

WILL BE TEACHER 9.4% Salary Hike Elementary Teachers

Halton County elementary school teachers have accepted a new salary package that will give them 9.4 per cent salary increases in 1970-

Liberty Pease, chairman of the board of education's salary negotiation committce, told the board that the 9.4 per cent increase included the annual increments and would mean an average increase of \$700 to \$800 for teachers. The highest individual increase in any salary was \$1,200 he added.

The salary schedule offers \$5,500 for a beginning teacher with no experience and

\$7,100 for a beginning teacher with 4 years experience. Top salary is \$14,900 for a teacher with 14 years experience.

Salaries for principals will range between \$15,000 and \$19,750. Maximum for vice principals is set at \$14,250, and the minimum s \$12,500.

Under fringe benefits, the hoard will pay 66 2-3 per cent of OHSIP basic rate an 50 per cent of OHS basic

The board also provides an allowance of \$500 for a post graduate degree, \$2,000 for consultant status, and \$800 for special staff.
