Delay Plans for CAS Move Could be in County Building

The Halton Children's Aid Society (CAS) "is going to take another look" at its proposed move to new quarters in Burlington, Warden Allan Day said last week.

A two hour meeting was held in Milton by Betty Graham, the director of the child welfare branch of the provincial department of social and family services; acting CAS director Bryan Harris, CAS president Dennis Toews, and county councillors who sit on the CAS board of directors.

OFFERED SPARE

Day said that at the meeting the county offered CAS 5,000 square feet of space in a new county administration building which supposedly would be built alongside the present administration building in Milton. The present building would be sold to the province.

While granting that CAS was "very anxious" to move out of cramped quarters in Milton, Day could not offer any timetable for construction of the

building, since it is still in the discussion stage.

PRESSURE

Miss Graham said that the province "is quite in agreement with Halton County in making this offer." Queen's Park has already put pressure on the CAS says Day, not to sign any lease in Burlington.

Would Add 1000 Acres Of Esqueing to Acton

While it's 'nice' to see a town grow, growth can be a mixed blessing, according to Acton's planning consultant, John Flood, of Projects Planning Associates.

Confronted earlier last week by a 30 voice delegation armed with an annexation petition, Acton planning board asked Mr. Flood's advice Thursday night, about tentative plans to annex 1,000 acres of Esqueing land, east of Acton.

The petition signed by 12 property owners, specified an area of 600 acres, but local planners added 400 more in their recommendation to council.

Spokesmen for the delegation thought an early application was essential in order to get an Ontario Municipal Board hearing before the province implemented its 'design for development' — regional government. They suggested that now is a good time for further expansion.

Chairman Sid Saitz said the Planning Board had been thinking in terms of annexation. "But we weren't in any hurry. Now, we're being forced into it by the petition."

The delegation, Planning Board's biggest in recent years was not unanimous. Some half-dozen property owners objected to annexation on increased taxation grounds.

Also questioned at the special meeting was the issue of licenses which would affect several industries in the area proposed for annexation, for example Tyler Transport.

The petition named three farm properties, Sprowl and Mc Culloch on Churchill Rd., and the Lindsay farm on highway 7.

Planning Board having taken an affirmative stand, passed the ball to town council via a recommendation to proceed with an application for annexation of lots 26, 27, 28, 29, and 30 east to the fourth line.

Remand Two Youths Garage Theft Charge

A 16 year old Georgetown youth who pleaded guilty to a charge of breaking and entering a Georgetown garage with intent to commit theft, must report weekly to the Georgetown police station until he appears again for sentence before Judge James R. Black in provincial court.

The court ordered a pre-sentence report on him and another youth aged 17 when they appeared jointly charged with the robbery attempt of Masson Motors on Guelph Street, April 4.

Fine, Suspension On Driving Charge

"Your kind of driving is the kind that everyone in the courts would like to see barred from the roads," Judge James R. Black remarked Wednesday in fining a Willowdale man \$100 or 20 days for careless driving. He also had his license suspended for three months. He pleaded guilty.

The court was told that he was observed by Georgetown police cadet Brian Farrell driving erratically around a Georgetown shopping plaza.

He had narrowly missed colliding with another car according to evidence, and drove past a block of stores at about 40 miles per hour. Children were playing in the area, the cadet noted and could have stepped off into the path of the car.

Following conviction of the Willowdale man, a second charge against him was withdrawn.

LEFT HOME

"The court doesn't look kindly on a person defying the court's instructions," Judge Black commented after hearing the youth say, "I can't stand it at home."

The youth's father said he had tried to keep his son at home but the boy had left the house after failing to go to work. He did not return.

The pair were remanded until July 8 for sentence on the charge.
