## Black Creek, Art Gallery On Ashgrove W.I. Tour

On Wednesday morning, June 17, twenty W.I. members and one visitor left in cars from the Hillcrest parking lot for Black Creek Pioneer Village where they spent a delightful time in- specting the different buildings. It is a farm settlement typical of the first communities of southern Ontario before confeder- ation, and the first settlers were Daniel and Elizabeth Stong in 1832. The barn still has the implements they used. There is an outdoor bake oven, harness shop, and a large herb garden, and a mill powered by water wheel. They enjoyed a ride in the wagon drawn by horses over to the museum building which contains many articles well over a century old. At noon a delightful lunch was enjoyed in the cool downstairs room of the Halfway House which in olden days was a stagecoach stop on the Toronto to Kingston road and provided accommodation for travellers and boarders.

They then went to the McMichael Conservation art collection in the village of Kleinburg where some 600 paintings, by Canada's most famous landscape artists are on display, as well as superb carvings by native Indian & Eskimo sculptors.

Final stop was at the Daphne leathercraft shop at Caledon East where the women enjoyed browsing around among the jewellery, wall hangings and sculpture, all done in leather. It was a very hot day with the temperature in the 80s, but all agreed they had seen some very

worthwhile things and thanks go to the committee, Mrs. Ralph Cunningham and Mrs. W. Stringer for planning the outing.

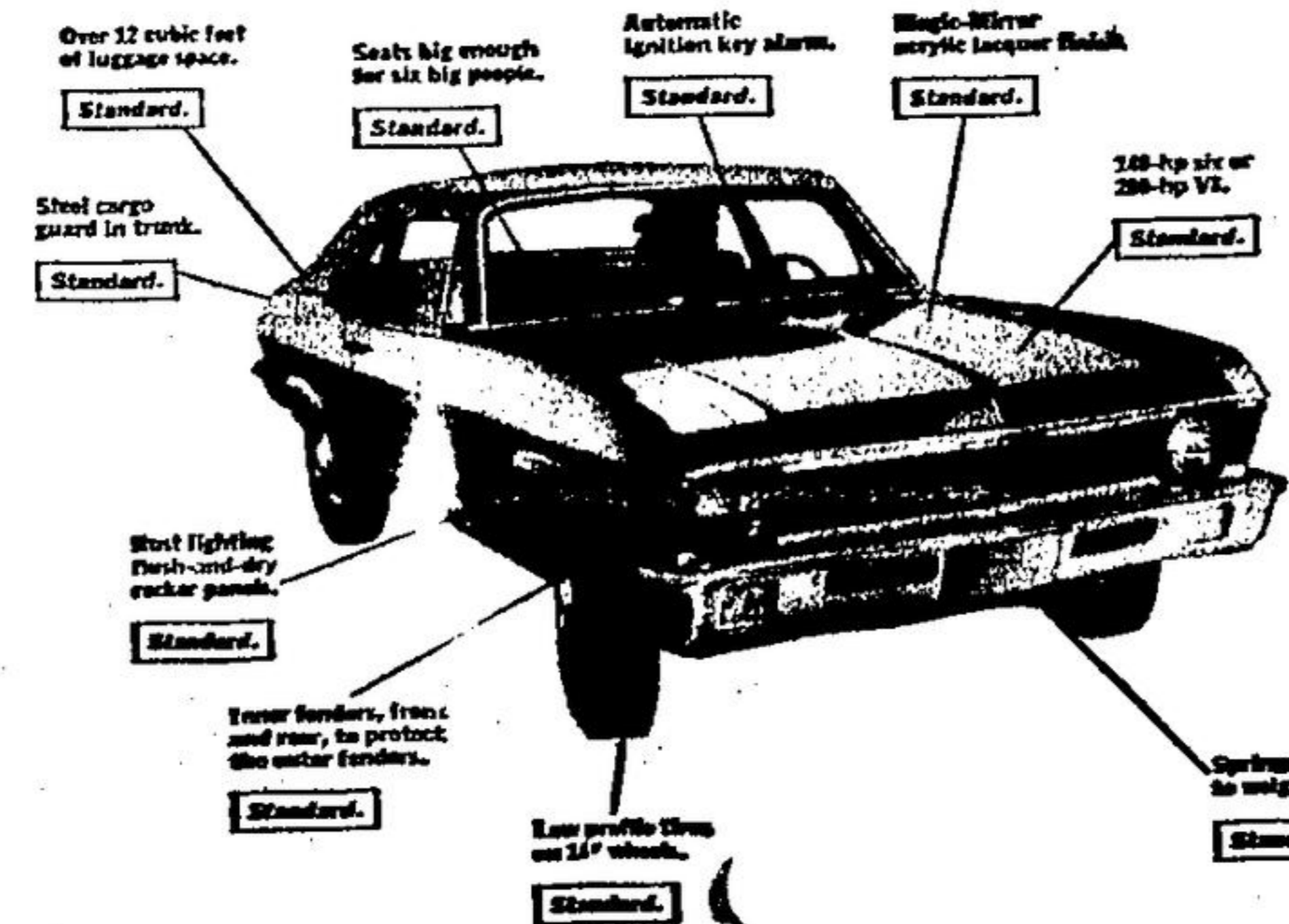
