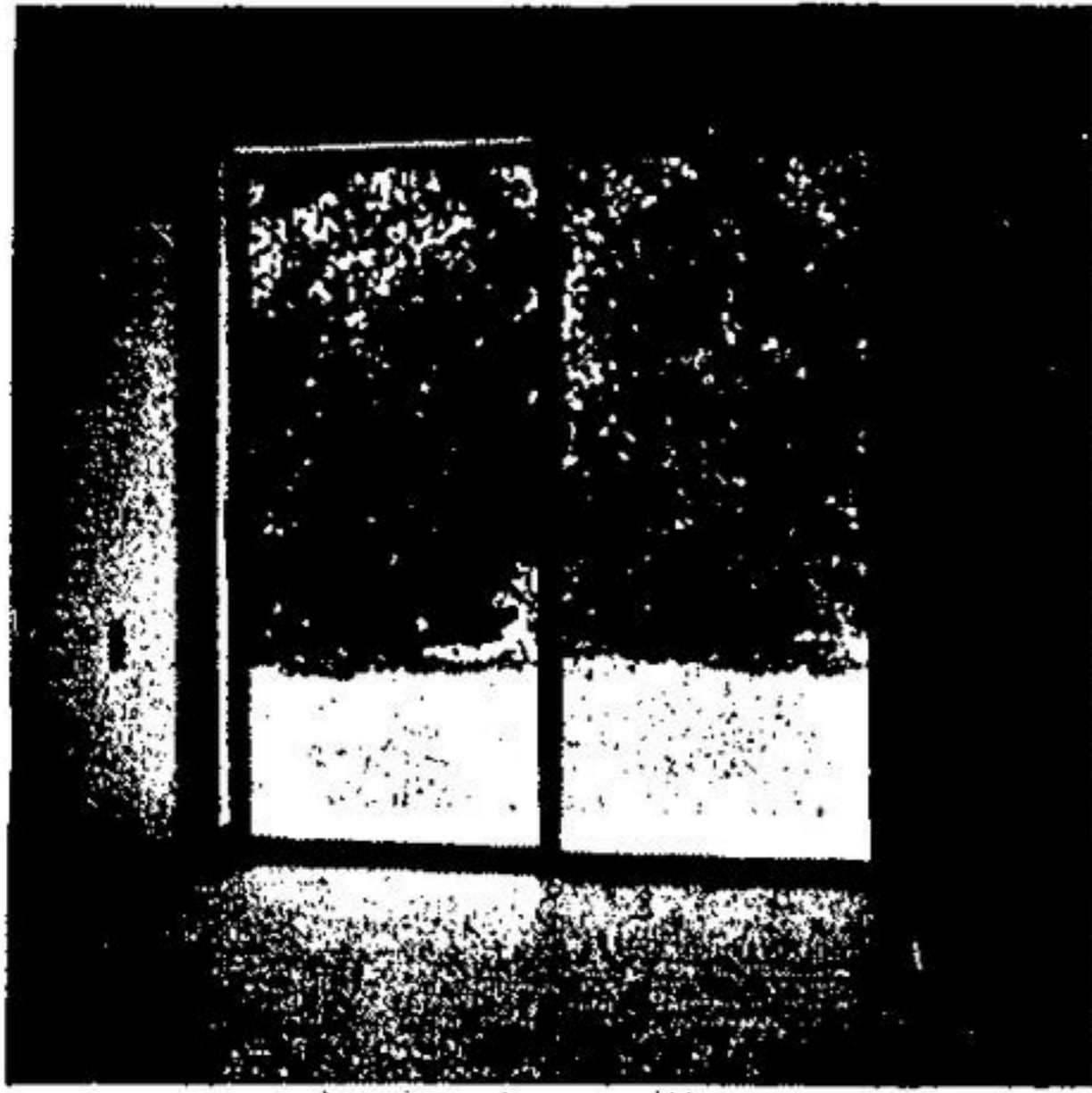


Seniors Apartments Filling Up

Half Tenants Moved In

The senior citizens apartments on Hyde Park Avenue, looking more like a fancy motel than apartments, is completed with half the tenants already moved in, and the other half scheduled for August 1, occupation. Only two of the 24 apartments are not rented at the moment.

The motel look is carried out by the long, low one-story building with each suite opening to the outside through sliding glass doors. The outside of the building is landscaped with shrubs, trees and hedges, with modern lamp standards along the walks.

COMMON ROOM

Each tenant has a living room with sliding glass doors to the outside, a complete kitchen with stove and refrigerator, a bedroom and bathroom. The bath-tubs have hand rails built along the edges for safety.

In addition there is a large common room, equipped with a complete kitchen for entertaining friends, bingo, or card games.

There is also a large automatic laundry area.

The rents are graduated according to income, with all tenants coming from Georgetown or Esquimaux.

DAVE MURRAY FEELS HE'S DUE FOR A CHANGE

Times and people change. And Dave Murray, resources manager of the Halton Region Conservation Authority, feels he is due for a change and is leaving the authority for a similar position with the Rideau Valley Conservation Authority near Ottawa.

His decision to leave the HIRCA was made about a month ago, he said in an interview and it was made final during a closed meeting of the authority's executive Thursday night.

DIDN'T AGREE

"The Ontario government Department of Energy and Resources Management, which employs me has been encouraging authorities to go out on their own rather than be an arm of the government. The Halton

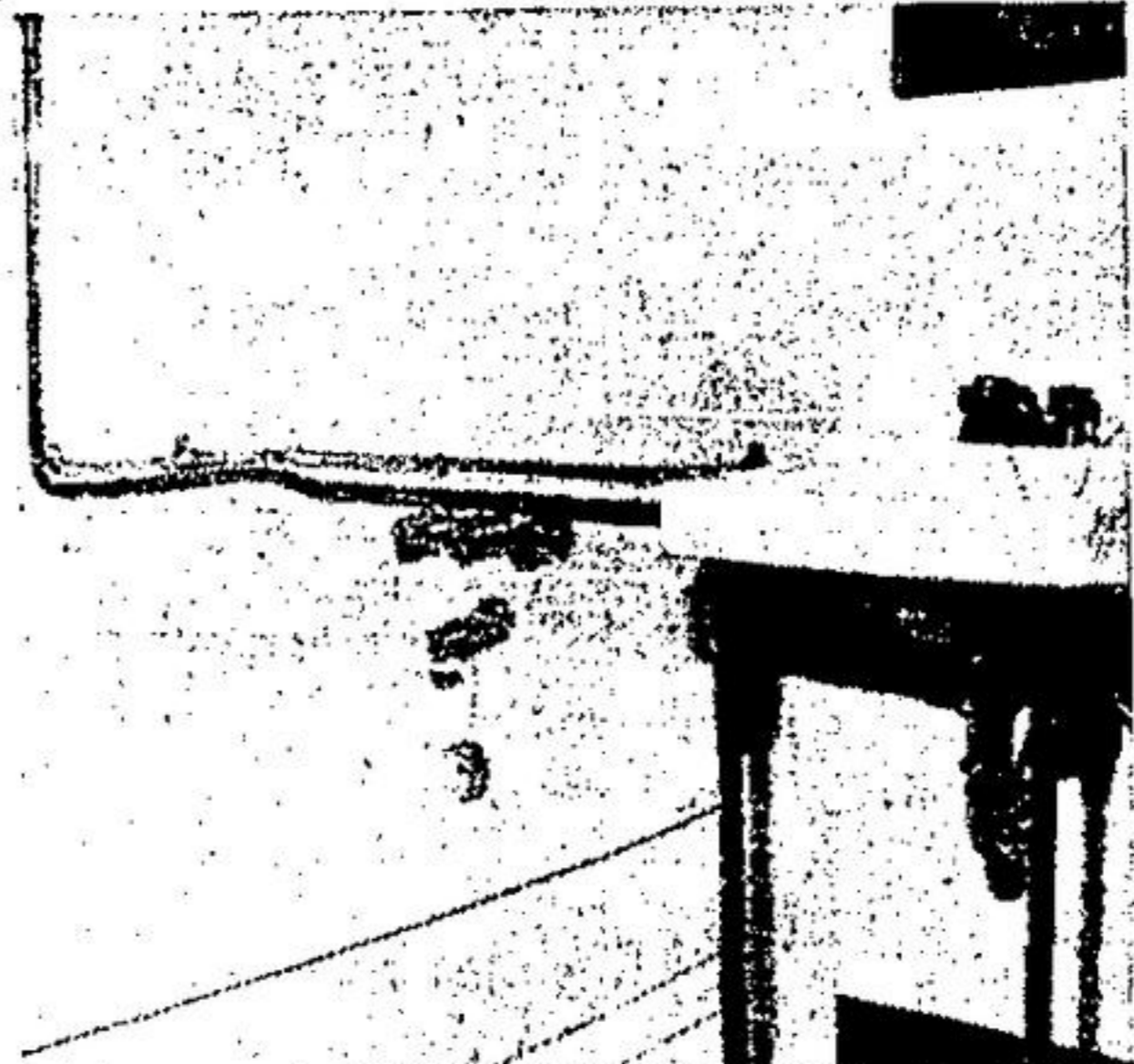
Authority is going this way and when they offered me the job as general manager of the area I didn't agree to their terms and decided to stay with the government," he said.

Murray is to assume his new duties with the Rideau Authority August 4. While their headquarters are in Kemptonville, the authority takes in the city of Ottawa and its outlying rural area which is dotted throughout by lakes.

His successor will be an employee of the authority.

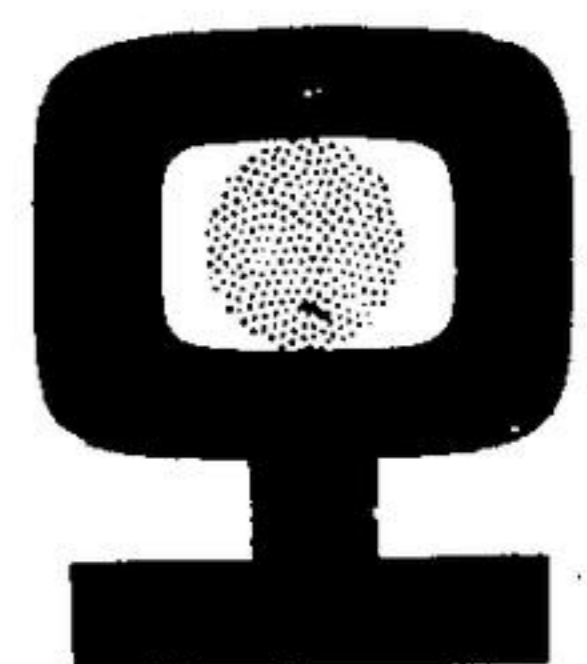

Former Terra Cotta Man Was Merchant And Quarryman

Once proprietor of a general store where Terra Cotta Inn is now located, James Lawrence Craine, 83, died in South Peel hospital Cooksville on June 15.

Mr. Craine had been a partner in a stone quarrying business as well.

Born at Mimesa he was taken to Michigan in infancy, moved to Terra Cotta in 1913 and lived there until moving to New Toronto in 1940. He was employed with the John Inglis firm during the war and was working at the Goodyear plant when he retired.

He was a member of the Terra Cotta ball team in his youth.

Mr. Craine and the former Martha (Dolly) Dawson were married in 1914 at Terra Cotta by Rev. J. M. Roadhouse, minister of Georgetown Methodist Church. He was a member of Terra Cotta Methodist church.

Predeceased by his wife in 1966, he leaves a sister May, Mrs. Thomas Hilson of New Toronto, formerly of Kelso.

Rev. Robert Scrivens conducted the funeral service at the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home here and interment was in Greenwood Cemetery. Pallbearers were Thomas Hayward, Guelph, Gord Stringer, Brampton, Charles McNally, Terra Cotta, Tom Ledwidge, Albert Dawson and John Knight.
