NEWS ECHOES

From the Heralds of 10, 20 and 30 Years Ago

1960

The Saturday evening opening of the new North Hutton Kart Club track south of Limehouse on the 5th line of Esquesing turned out to be fun time for all. About 150 interested visitors were invited to watch the races and some of the more adventurous types got their chance to drive a kart. Representatives of the service clubs, school board, council, police, and fire departments were turned loose on the track.

A town landmark for many years the old CNR water tower has disappeared from its familiar dominating location just south of the station platform. One of the many facilities made obsolete with the CNR's conversion from steam to diesel locomotives, the big tank was last used by the railway on Monday, April 20, 1959. It was built in 1923.
