Regional Indecision, School Board Stays In Rented Office

Indecision about a regional government scheme to serve Halton will force the board of education to stay in its rented central administration offices until summer 1971.

The board had leased its present quarters in Oakville from Singer of Canada Ltd. from 1968 to 1971.

MOVED

Singer moved its operations to Quebec, but last year told the board that the company wished to re-establish itself in its old quarters in Oakville.

The company indicated that it would take over the building when the board's lease expires, but added that it would make a rebate if the board could arrange to move to new facilities earlier.

REBATE

The building represents an annual expenditure of about \$52,000 for the board therefore prospects of a rebate seemed attractive.

A committee was appointed by the board to investigate various types of accommodation which would suit the needs of administrative staff.

The initial questions were

whether the board would build a new facility, renovate one of its existing buildings or rent quarters from an outside source.

LACK INFORMATION

The great problem, though, was the lack of specific information on Halton's place in a regional government scheme for this area, said Lavender.

Bruce Lindley, superintendent of business and finance for the board, agreed. He said the committee could make no valid decision on location, size or type of structure the board would require until the department of municipal affairs decides the fate of Burlington in the Halton regional government scheme.

HAS PROTESTED

The separation of Burlington from Halton County in any regional government scheme would result in the loss of a significant portion of the system's revenue. The board, along with the majority of Halton civic bodies has protested any such move.

Municipal Affairs Minister Darcy McKeough said he would not make an announcement on the subject until fall.

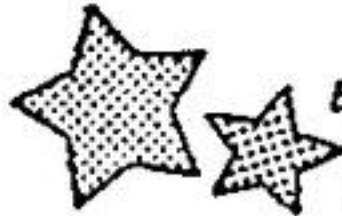

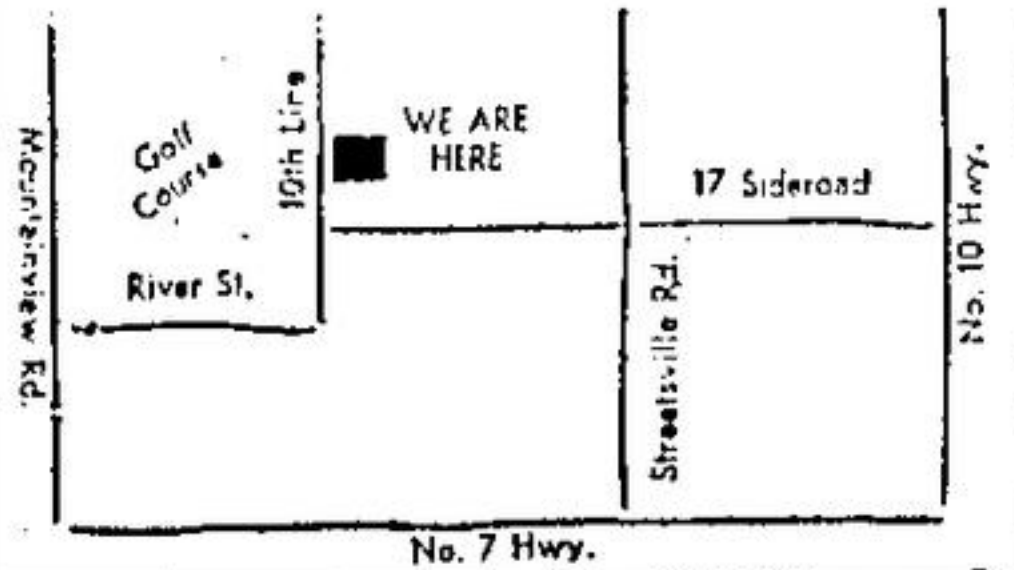
