North Halton OPP Weekly Report

During the week of July 5-11 officers of the Milton Detachment, Ontario Provincial Police worked a total of 1,174 hours and effected patrols on 10,293 miles of area highways, county and township roads. A total of 16 motorists were summoned for court appearance as a result of traffic violations, and an additional 18 received warnings. Convictions were registered against 48 persons during proceedings in Provincial Judge's Court, Milton.

Officers responded to 63 general occurrences this week. Included were 2 thefts, 1 breaking and entering investigation, 6 disturbances, and 1 domestic complaint. Three investigations under the Liquor Control Act resulted in charges against 3 persons. All other occurrences were of a minor nature and required little time to clear.

The number of traffic accidents investigated rose to 20 during this time period. Of these 18 were property damage only and the remaining 3 were personal injury mishaps resulting in injury to 10. One accident was fatal with one person killed. Investigation led to 15 charges being laid under the Highway Traffic Act, and the Criminal Code of Canada. Total property damage was estimated at \$13,087. Causes of accidents were careless driving, driver lost control, inattentive driving, animal, car on fire, fall to stop and following too close.

When in doubt, play it short — that's the rule a golfer follows when approaching an unfamiliar green. It's a good rule for motorists too, says the Ontario Motor League. When in doubt about what the driver ahead is going to do, give him ample room and be ready for the unexpected. And, when you approach an intersection, slow down and be prepared to stop in case another driver comes along who can't stop. When driving play it safe.

Frank Terry Was Acton Postmaster For 27 Years

A resident of Acton for 27 years and a former postmaster there, Frank Terry died following a fatal heart seizure while playing in a postmasters golf tournament at the Wasaga Beach Golf and Country Club.

Mr. Terry had moved to Owen Sound 10 years ago as postmaster.

Mr. Terry is survived by his wife, the former Irene Glendinning of Galt; one daughter Patricia (Mrs. Lorne McBride) of Kitchener, two grandchildren Beverly and Terry; and a sister Helen Terry in Calgary. He was born April 13, 1910 in England, son of the late Edward and Mary Jane Terry, and came to Canada in 1915. Mr. and Mrs. Terry were married at Galt in 1933.

He went to Acton at 18, and worked as outside foreman at Beardmore and Co. During World War II he served overseas with Hamilton Light Infantry regiment, rising to the rank of captain. He was a Lloyd member of the Owen Sound Legion and a past member of Acton Legion.

He was a former member of Walker Lodge A.F. and A.M.
