

'70 Ford Ambulance is New GVAS Acquisition

The Georgetown Volunteer Ambulance Service has a brand new '70 Ford ambulance, replacing the '52 Cadillac, which has seen better days.

This ambulance, unlike the previous ones, was not paid for by the Georgetown taxpayers. It was completely paid for by the Ontario Hospital Services Commission.

The ambulance is fully equipped with rescue equipment, two stretchers, oxygen, aspirator, and its own 110 volt supply to run equipment. It has the two tone European horn rather than a siren. This will become mandatory on all ambulances, so they have a distinctive sound, which cannot be confused with police or fire sirens. Also distinctive is the alternating red and white rotating light on the top of the ambulance.

The electric horn can also be used as a public address system, to control crowds, or to request a right of way. In addition it can be used as a receiver when the men are some distance from the ambulance. It could be possible they could receive instructions from a doctor while tending a victim on the side of the road.



Service urgently needs volunteers who can do daytime shifts, while anyone who can do any shift is welcome. It is the day time coverage which is most urgently needed. The Georgetown Ambulance Service was formed 13 years ago, and, as far as can be ascertained, was the first volunteer ambulance service in Canada.

Now Pay Equal For Same Qualifications

Halt County Board of Education has voted to put an additional \$3,000 towards elementary teacher salaries in the county.
